

## 2 Higher Education - Senatorial Scholarships - Private Career Schools

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the requirements for application for a senatorial scholarship 4 to include students who are enrolled in private career schools; authorizing the use of 5 a senatorial scholarship at certain private career schools; authorizing certain 6 recipients of a senatorial scholarship to hold the scholarship for a certain duration under certain circumstances; authorizing the Maryland Higher Education 7 8 Commission to make certain awards to certain applicants under certain 9 circumstances; making certain stylistic changes; making this Act an emergency 10 measure; and generally relating to the use of senatorial scholarships at private 11 career schools.
- 12 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 14 Section 18–402(a), 18–405, 18–406, and 18–407(b)

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Education
- 20 18–402.
- 21 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, each applicant 22 for a senatorial scholarship shall:
- 23 (i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Office; and



1 to pay for off-campus housing.

- (d) Each Senator may award not more than 10 percent of the funds available under this subtitle to applicants planning to attend accredited undergraduate, graduate, or professional institutions **OR PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOLS** outside the State, provided the applicant:
- 6 (1) Will be studying in an academic area that is not available in the State;
- 7 (2) Is a hearing impaired person who will be studying at an institution 8 outside the State that makes special provisions for hearing impaired students, and 9 comparable special provisions are not available to the applicant at an institution in the 10 State; or
- 11 (3) Is an individual who is on active duty with the United States military who is domiciled in this State.

- 14 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to § 18–406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient:
- 17 (1) Is a full–time student;
- 18 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and
- 19 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate 21 student each semester leading to a degree.
- 22 (b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold 23 the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if the recipient:
  - (1) Is a part–time student;
- 25 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and
- 26 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree.
- 28 (c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one—half of the yearly 29 award for summer school.
- 30 (d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate program as provided in § 18–402(a) of this subtitle may hold the scholarship for 2 years if 32 [he is a full-time] THE student IS ENROLLED FULL-TIME and otherwise meets the

conditions of subsection (a) of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if [he is a part-time] THE student IS ENROLLED PART-TIME and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (b) of this section.

- (e) Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a **PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOL OR A** private postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education:
- 7 (1) May hold the scholarship for the completion of one program if the 8 student otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)(1) and (2) of this section; and
- 9 (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the 10 SCHOOL OR institution for the completion of the program.
- 11 (f) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is an individual who is on active 12 duty with the United States military and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a) 13 or (b) of this section may be domiciled in this State rather than a resident of this State.

- 15 (b) If any Senator fails to award all of the Senator's scholarships on or before 16 September 1 of each year, the Commission shall make the remaining awards to applicants 17 from the Senator's legislative district who:
- 18 (1) Scored highest on the competitive examination; or
- 19 (2) Are attending an eligible institution **OR PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOL** 20 and have completed at least 1 year in good academic standing.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
