BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Government Section 9-957 Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 1 (a) (1) 2 (2)"Eligible veteran" means an individual who: 3 (i) served on active duty in: the armed forces of the United States; 4 1. 2. the National Guard; or 5 6 3. a reserve component of the armed forces of the United 7 States: 8 (ii) served in a capacity other than for training; 9 (iii) was discharged or released under conditions other than 10 dishonorable; and 11 (iv) 1. is a resident of the State; or 12 2. receives treatment from Veterans' or care 13 Administration hospital in the State. 14 "Fund" means the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program Fund established under subsection (f) of this section. 15 "Nonprofit training entity" means a corporation, a foundation, or any 16 **(4)** 17 other legal entity that: 18 (i) is qualified under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; 19 engages in the training of service dogs for support dogs for use (ii) 20 by veterans; and 21 has been selected by the Department to provide services under (iii) 22this section. 23(5)"Program" means the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program established under subsection (b) of this section. 2425"Program participant" means an eligible veteran who participates in (6)the Program. 2627 "Successful Program participant" means a Program participant who

successfully completes the training protocol specified by a nonprofit training entity.

1 There is a Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program in the Department. (b) 2 (c) The purposes of the Program are to: 3 (1) refer eligible veterans who inquire about participation in the Program 4 to one or more nonprofit training entities: 5 (2)provide additional funding mechanisms to assist veterans participating 6 in the Program; 7 (3)encourage successful Program participants to assist in outreach and 8 referral of other eligible veterans who could benefit from participation in the Program; 9 **(4)** assist in the reduction of the Maryland veteran suicide rate; and 10 identify potential capital projects and services to facilitate more (5)services for veterans in the State. 11 The Department shall select at least one nonprofit training entity to: 12 (d) (1) 13 implement a training protocol for the purposes of the Program (i) 14 that will teach each Program participant methodologies, strategies, and techniques for partnering with service dogs for support dogs; 15 16 select qualified Program participants from those eligible (ii) 17 veterans referred to the nonprofit entity under the Program; 18 (iii) select an appropriate service dog for support dogf for each 19 Program participant; 20 facilitate each Program participant's training using the nonprofit (iv) 21training entity's training protocol; and 22 (v) partner each successful Program participant with the service dog 23for support dog on the Program participant's successful completion of the nonprofit 24training entity's training protocol. 25 To be eligible for selection under paragraph (1) of this subsection, a 26nonprofit entity must: 27 be based in the State: (i) 28(ii) serve the needs of the veteran population in the State; and 29 generate its own revenue and reinvest the proceeds of that revenue in the growth and development of its programs. 30



- 1 (7) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same 2 manner as other State money may be invested.
- 3 (8) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the General Fund 4 of the State.
- 5 (9) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the 6 State budget.
- 7 (10) Money expended from the Fund is supplemental to and is not intended 8 to take the place of funding that otherwise would be appropriated for the Program.
- 9 (g) (1) For the purpose of implementing this section, the Department may 10 accept gifts or grants for donation to the Fund.
- 11 (2) On or before October 1, 2018, and each October 1 thereafter, the
 12 Department shall post and maintain on its [Web site] WEBSITE a list [of the names of the
 13 persons who have] CONTAINING THE NAMES OF ALL PERSONS WHO HAVE donated to
 14 the Fund in the previous year and [have not requested anonymity] HAVE AUTHORIZED
 15 THE DEPARTMENT TO PUBLISH THEIR NAMES ON ITS WEBSITE.
- 16 (h) The Department shall adopt regulations to implement this section, including 17 regulations establishing procedures for the Department to:
- 18 (1) promote the Program to eligible veterans through the Department's 19 outreach methods;
- 20 (2) refer eligible veterans to selected nonprofit entities;
- 21 (3) receive donations for the Fund through a link placed in a prominent 22 location on the Department's [Web site] WEBSITE; and
- 23 (4) use revenue from the Fund to pay selected nonprofit entities for services 24 that are provided through the Program.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
