A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Corporations and Associations – Resident Agent – Quantity and Resignation

FOR the purpose of requiring a Maryland corporation, a limited liability partnership, a
limited partnership, and a Maryland statutory trust to have a resident agent, rather
than at least one resident agent; altering the circumstances that determine when a
resignation of a resident agent for certain business entities is effective; and generally
relating to business entities and resident agents.
