A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Health Benefit Exchange – Criminal History Records Checks – Contractors With Access to Federal Tax Information

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange to require certain $\mathbf{5}$ contractors to provide certain information for a certain background investigation; 6 authorizing the Exchange to request from the Criminal Justice Information System 7 Central Repository a State and national criminal history records check for certain 8 contractors; authorizing the Exchange to collect and submit to the Central 9 Repository certain fees and information from certain contractors; authorizing the 10 Exchange to conduct a certain reinvestigation within a certain period of time after a 11 previous background investigation; requiring the Central Repository to forward 12certain criminal history record information to the Exchange and certain contractors; 13 providing that certain information is confidential and may be used only for certain 14 purposes; requiring the Central Repository to provide revised criminal history record 15information under certain circumstances; authorizing certain contractors to contest 16under certain provisions of law certain information issued by the Central Repository; 17prohibiting certain contractors from performing certain work functions for the 18 Exchange under certain circumstances; authorizing the Maryland Health Benefit 19Exchange Board to adopt certain regulations, guidelines, and policies; providing that 20this Act does not limit the authority of the Exchange to perform certain actions in 21accordance with certain provisions of law; specifying the purpose of this Act; defining 22certain terms; and generally relating to the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange and 23criminal background checks for contractors with access to federal tax information.

15 16 17 18 19	(B) THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IS TO AUTHORIZE THE EXCHANGE TO PERFORM A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK, INCLUDING A STATE AND NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK, TO DETERMINE THE SUITABILITY OF A CONTRACTOR TO ACCESS CONFIDENTIAL OR SENSITIVE FEDERAL TAX INFORMATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS.
$20 \\ 21 \\ 22$	(C) FOR ANY CONTRACTOR WHO HAS OR MAY OBTAIN ACCESS TO FEDERAL TAX INFORMATION THAT IS CONSIDERED CONFIDENTIAL OR SENSITIVE UNDER FEDERAL OR STATE LAW OR REGULATION, THE EXCHANGE MAY:
$23\\24\\25$	(1) REQUIRE THE CONTRACTOR TO PROVIDE INFORMATION NECESSARY TO PERFORM A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK INCLUDING, FOR AT LEAST THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING 5-YEAR PERIOD, THE CONTRACTOR'S:
26	(I) ADDRESS HISTORY; AND
27 28	(II) EMPLOYMENT AND EDUCATION HISTORY, INCLUDING THE NAMES AND ADDRESSES OF ALL PREVIOUS EMPLOYERS AND SCHOOLS ATTENDED;
29 30	(2) REQUEST A STATE AND NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK ON THE CONTRACTOR FROM THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY;

1 (3) AS PART OF THE APPLICATION FOR A CRIMINAL HISTORY 2 RECORDS CHECK, COLLECT FROM THE CONTRACTOR AND SUBMIT TO THE CENTRAL 3 REPOSITORY:

4 (I) TWO COMPLETE SETS OF THE CONTRACTOR'S LEGIBLE
5 FINGERPRINTS TAKEN IN A FORMAT APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL
6 REPOSITORY AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION;

7 (II) THE FEE AUTHORIZED UNDER § 10-221(B)(7) OF THE 8 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE FOR ACCESS TO MARYLAND CRIMINAL HISTORY 9 RECORDS;

10 (III) THE MANDATORY PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE 11 FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION FOR A NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY 12 RECORDS CHECK; AND

13(IV) ANY OTHER DOCUMENTS OR FEES REQUIRED BY THE14CENTRAL REPOSITORY FOR COMPLETION OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS15CHECK; AND

16(4)CONDUCT A REINVESTIGATION WITHIN 10 YEARS AFTER THE DATE17OF THE PREVIOUS BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION FOR EACH CONTRACTOR WITH18ACCESS TO FEDERAL TAX INFORMATION.

19 (D) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10–201 THROUGH 10–229 OF THE CRIMINAL 20 PROCEDURE ARTICLE, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL FORWARD TO THE 21 CONTRACTOR AND THE EXCHANGE THE CONTRACTOR'S CRIMINAL HISTORY 22 RECORD INFORMATION.

23 (E) INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY UNDER 24 THIS SECTION:

25 (1) IS CONFIDENTIAL;

26(2)MAY NOT BE REDISSEMINATED EXCEPT AS ALLOWED BY FEDERAL27OR STATE LAW OR REGULATION; AND

28(3)MAY BE USED ONLY FOR THE PURPOSES AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS29SECTION.

30 (F) A CONTRACTOR WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY 31 RECORDS CHECK UNDER THIS SECTION MAY CONTEST THE CRIMINAL HISTORY 32 RECORD INFORMATION ISSUED BY THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AS PROVIDED IN § 1 10-223 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE.

2 (G) IF CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION IS REPORTED TO THE 3 CENTRAL REPOSITORY AFTER THE DATE OF THE INITIAL CRIMINAL HISTORY 4 RECORDS CHECK, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL PROVIDE TO THE EXCHANGE 5 AND THE CONTRACTOR REVISED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION ON THE 6 CONTRACTOR.

7 (H) A CONTRACTOR WHO REFUSES TO COMPLY WITH OR FAILS THE 8 CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT PERFORM 9 WORK FUNCTIONS FOR THE EXCHANGE THAT REQUIRE ACCESS TO FEDERAL TAX 10 INFORMATION.

11 **(I)** THE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS, GUIDELINES, AND POLICIES TO 12 CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.

13 (J) THIS SECTION DOES NOT LIMIT THE AUTHORITY OF THE EXCHANGE TO 14 PERFORM A BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION OR REQUEST A CRIMINAL HISTORY 15 RECORDS CHECK FOR PERSONNEL IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 7–103 AND 7–104 OF 16 THE STATE PERSONNEL AND PENSIONS ARTICLE.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 June 1, 2018.

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
