A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Health Occupations - Athletic Trainers Act - Revisions

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice athletic training"; altering the composition of the Athletic Trainer Advisory Committee; specifying that certain 4 5 members of the Committee may be appointed from a certain list of individuals 6 submitted to the State Board of Physicians by a certain successor organization; 7 requiring a licensed athletic trainer to practice athletic training in accordance with 8 standards of practice established by certain organizations; repealing certain provisions of law requiring an athletic trainer to practice in a certain setting; altering 9 the information that is required to be included in an evaluation and treatment 10 11 protocol; repealing certain definitions; repealing certain obsolete provisions; 12 requiring that the terms of certain members of the Athletic Trainer Advisory 13 Committee terminate on the effective date of this Act; making conforming changes; 14 and generally relating to the Athletic Trainers Act.

- 25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations



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- 2 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 3 (b) "Alternate supervising physician" means one or more physicians designated 4 by the supervising physician to provide supervision of an athletic trainer:
- 5 (1) During the absence of the supervising physician; and
- 6 (2) In accordance with the evaluation and treatment protocol on file with 7 the Board.
- 8 **[**(c) "Athlete" means an individual who participates in an athletic activity.
- 9 (d) "Athletic activity" means exercise, recreation, sport, competition, or game 10 that:
- 11 (1) Requires physical strength, range of motion, flexibility, control, speed, stamina, or agility; and
- 13 (2) Is associated with a setting as defined under this section, an 14 educational institution, or a professional, amateur, or recreational sports club or athletic 15 organization.
- 16 (e) "Athletic injury" means an injury that affects an athlete's participation or performance in an athletic activity.]
- 18 [(f)] (C) "Board" means the State Board of Physicians.
- 19 [(g)] (D) "Committee" means the Athletic Trainer Advisory Committee 20 established under § 14–5D–04 of this subtitle.
- 21 **[**(h) "Educational institution" includes:
- 22 (1) The schools in the public elementary and secondary education system 23 of the State;
- 24 (2) A noncollegiate educational institution governed under § 2–206 of the 25 Education Article; and
- 26 (3) An institution of higher education as defined in $\S 10-101$ of the 27 Education Article.
- [(i)] (E) "Evaluation and treatment protocol" means a document that is executed by a physician and an athletic trainer that meets the requirements of §

- 1 14–5D–11 of this subtitle.
- 2 [(j)] **(F)** "License" means a license issued by the Board to practice athletic 3 training.
- 4 [(k)] (G) "Licensed athletic trainer" means an individual who is licensed by the 5 Board to practice athletic training.
- 6 **[**(l)**] (H)** "Licensed health care practitioner" means an individual licensed, 7 certified, or otherwise authorized to practice a health occupation under this article.
- 8 [(m)] (I) "National certifying board" means the National Athletic Trainers' 9 Association Board of Certification, Inc., or its successor organization.
- 10 **[**(n)**] (J)** "Nonsupervising physician" means a physician licensed by the Board who is not the supervising physician of the licensed athletic trainer.
- [(o)] (K) "Outside referral" means a request for treatment from a nonsupervising physician or licensed health care practitioner.
- [(p) (1) "Practice athletic training" means application of the following principles and methods for managing athletic injuries for athletes in good overall health under the supervision of a licensed physician:
- 17 (i) Prevention;
- 18 (ii) Clinical evaluation and assessment;
- 19 (iii) Immediate care; and
- 20 (iv) Treatment, rehabilitation, and reconditioning.
- 21 (2) "Practice athletic training" includes:
- 22 (i) Organization and administration of an athletic training 23 program; and
- 24 (ii) Instruction to coaches, athletes, parents, medical personnel, and 25 community members regarding the care and prevention of athletic injuries.


