- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the type of fertilizer and the application rate at which a certain type of fertilizer may be applied to turf by a professional fertilizer applicator during 4 $\mathbf{5}$ a certain time of the year; altering certain restrictions on the application of a 6 fertilizer containing nitrogen to turf by a professional fertilizer applicator; altering 7 certain limitations on the application of an enhanced efficiency fertilizer by a professional fertilizer applicator; altering certain conditions under which a 8 9 professional fertilizer applicator may apply organic or natural organic fertilizer 10 containing phosphorus; and generally relating to fertilizer use on turf.
