## 2 Adult Correctional Institutions – Financial Literacy and Entrepreneurship <u>Pilot</u> 3 <u>Program Curriculum – Development and Implementation</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring the Correctional Education Council, in collaboration with the 4 Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning and the Director of 5 6 Education and Workforce Skills Training for Correctional Institutions in the 7 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, to develop and implement, on or 8 before a certain date, a financial literacy and entrepreneurship pilot program with 9 curriculum to be offered as part of certain transition training to certain inmates in 10 the Division of Correction; requiring the curriculum content to include certain 11 instruction; requiring the program to be offered at a correctional institution determined by the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services; authorizing 12 13 the program to be offered to enhance a certain mandatory education program or as separate classes under certain circumstances; authorizing the Council to coordinate 14 with certain other entities that offer to provide certain resources at no cost to the 15 State; specifying the resources that certain other entities may provide; and generally 16 relating to the development and implementation of a financial literacy and 17 18 entrepreneurship <del>curriculum</del> pilot program at adult correctional institutions.
