- FOR the purpose of requiring a certain amount of funding in the annual budget for activities aimed at reducing tobacco use in Maryland; and generally relating to funding for the Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Program.

- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 15 (a) For fiscal year 2011 and fiscal year 2012, the Governor shall include at least
- 16 \$6,000,000 in the annual budget in appropriations for activities aimed at reducing tobacco
- 17 use in Maryland as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention,
- 18 including:
- 19 (1) Media campaigns aimed at reducing smoking initiation and 20 encouraging smokers to quit smoking;
- 21 (2) Media campaigns educating the public about the dangers of secondhand 22 smoke exposure;
- 23 (3) Enforcement of existing laws banning the sale or distribution of tobacco

- 2 (4) Promotion and implementation of smoking cessation programs; and
- 3 (5) Implementation of school-based tobacco education programs.
- 4 (b) For fiscal [year 2013 and each fiscal year thereafter,] YEARS 2013, 2014, 5 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, AND 2019 the Governor shall include at least \$10,000,000 in the annual budget in appropriations for the purposes described in subsection (a) of this section.
- 7 (C) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE 8 GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE AT LEAST \$21,000,000 IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET IN 9 APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS 10 SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
