CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Registration Fee Exemptions – Disabled Veterans**

3 FOR the purpose of exempting vehicles leased to and personally used by certain disabled
4 veterans from vehicle registration fees; and generally relating to vehicle registration
5 fee exemptions for disabled veterans.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Transportation**

14 13–903.

15 (a) The following vehicles are exempt from the registration fees specified in this
16 subtitle:

1 (1) A vehicle that is owned and operated by the United States, this State,
2 or any political subdivision of this State;

3 (2) A vehicle that is owned by a volunteer fire company incorporated in this
4 State or by a rescue squad and that is used for firefighting or ambulance purposes;

5 (3) A canteen wagon of a recognized fire buff organization, as certified by
6 the International Fire Buffs Association;

7 (4) A vehicle owned and operated by the Civil Air Patrol;

8 (5) A vehicle owned and operated by a unit of a national veterans'
9 organization;

10 (6) A vehicle owned and operated by a Maryland chapter of the American
11 Red Cross;

12 (7) A motor vehicle and trailer known as the "40-8 box car" that is owned
13 and operated only for social or charitable purposes by any voiture of the Forty and Eight of
14 the American Legion, Department of Maryland;

15 (8) A vehicle owned **BY, OR LEASED TO**, and personally used by a veteran
16 who:

17 (i) As designated or classified by the Veterans' Administration, has
18 lost the use of a hand, arm, or leg, or is totally disabled; or

19 (ii) Has a permanent impairment of both eyes so that:

20 1. The central visual acuity is 20/200 or less in the better eye,
21 with corrective glasses; or

22 2. There is a field defect in which the peripheral field has
23 contracted to such an extent that the widest diameter of visual field subtends an angular
24 distance no greater than 20 degrees in the better eye;

25 (9) A vehicle owned and personally used by an individual who is at least 65
26 years old and is the surviving spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, as defined under §
27 7-208 of the Tax – Property Article; and

28 (10) A Type I or Type II school vehicle owned and operated by a religious
29 organization.

30 (b) The Administration may exempt from the registration fees specified in this
31 subtitle any vehicle of a law enforcement agency of the United States or of any other state,
32 if the United States or other state provides a reciprocal exemption for law enforcement
33 vehicles of this State.

1 (c) (1) Each registered vehicle that is exempt from registration fees under
2 subsection (a) of this section shall display a special identification marker approved by the
3 Administrator.

4 (2) The special identification marker for a motor vehicle and trailer exempt
5 under subsection (a)(7) of this section shall bear the number of the organization and the
6 number of the local voiture, reading “40-8-(local number)”.

7 (3) The special identification marker for a vehicle exempt under subsection
8 (a)(8)(i) of this section shall indicate that the Veterans’ Administration has designated or
9 classified the veteran as having lost the use of a hand, arm, or leg or as being totally
10 disabled.

11 (d) A disabled veteran whose vehicle is eligible for exemption under subsection
12 (a)(8) of this section may, if eligible, receive the special registration number and special
13 registration plates provided under § 13-616, § 13-617, § 13-618, § 13-619, § 13-619.1, or
14 § 13-619.2 of this title without payment of the registration fees specified in this subtitle.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16 October 1, 2018.
