### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Creation of a State Debt – Baltimore City – Mother Seton Academy

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$250,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Mother Seton Academy, 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Inc. for certain development or improvement purposes; providing for disbursement 6 of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a 7 matching fund; prohibiting the use of the loan proceeds or matching fund for 8 sectarian religious purposes; establishing a deadline for the encumbrance or 9 expenditure of the loan proceeds; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan. 10

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That:

13The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on (1)behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Baltimore City – 14 15Mother Seton Academy Loan of 2018 in a total principal amount equal to the lesser of (i) 16\$250,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in accordance with Section 1(5) 17below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general 18obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, 19and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the State Finance 20and Procurement Article.

(2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under §
8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for

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the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Mother Seton Academy, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Mother Seton Academy, located in Baltimore City.

6 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate 7 and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due 8 and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of 9 issuance of the bonds.

10 (5)Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the 11 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching 12fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, 13from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may 14consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date 15of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or 16assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the 17matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2020, to present 18 evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will be provided. 19 If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the 20matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of 21the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of 22the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works 23shall be canceled and be of no further effect.

24No portion of the proceeds of the loan or any of the matching funds may be (6)25used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in connection with the design, 26acquisition, or construction of any building used or to be used as a place of sectarian 27religious worship or instruction, or in connection with any program or department of 28divinity for any religious denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, the 29grantee shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the 30 loan or any matching funds have been or are being used for a purpose prohibited by this 31Act.

32 (7) The proceeds of the loan must be expended or encumbered by the Board of 33 Public Works for the purposes provided in this Act no later than June 1, 2025. If any funds 34 authorized by this Act remain unexpended or unencumbered after June 1, 2025, the 35 amount of the unencumbered or unexpended authorization shall be canceled and be of no 36 further effect. If bonds have been issued for the loan, the amount of unexpended or 37 unencumbered bond proceeds shall be disposed of as provided in § 8–129 of the State 38 Finance and Procurement Article.

39 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
 40 1, 2018.

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
