1 AN ACT concerning

Commission to Study Compliance by State Gaming Facility Licensees With the State Minority Business Enterprise Program

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission to Study Compliance by State Gaming $\mathbf{5}$ Facility Licensees With the State Minority Business Enterprise Program; providing 6 for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of 7 the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 8 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission to review, assess, and 9 examine certain matters and make findings and recommendations related to 10 certified minority business enterprise participation in procurement by State gaming 11 facility licensees; requiring the Commission to report its findings and 12 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain 13date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 14 Commission to Study Compliance by State Gaming Facility Licensees With the State 15Minority Business Enterprise Program.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

- (a) There is a Commission to Study Compliance by State Gaming FacilityLicensees With the State Minority Business Enterprise Program.

1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June
30, 2019, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
abrogated and of no further force and effect.
