2 **Higher Education – Senatorial and Delegate Scholarships – Reimbursement of**
3 **~~Certificate and License Programs~~ Expenses for Community College**
4 **Certification and Licensure**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain recipients of a senatorial scholarship to use the
6 scholarship to reimburse certain expenses for certificate or license programs or for
7 certain courses or sequences of courses at community colleges; exempting certain
8 applicants from the requirement that certain senatorial scholarship recipients take
9 a certain examination and be enrolled in certain institutions; authorizing certain
10 students to use a delegate scholarship to reimburse certain expenses for certificate
11 or license programs or for certain courses or sequences of courses at community
12 colleges; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the use of
13 senatorial and delegate scholarships for the reimbursement of expenses for

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Education**

16 18–401.

17 There is a program of senatorial scholarships in this State that are awarded under
18 this subtitle.

19 18–402.

20 (a) (1) Except as provided in [paragraph] **PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3)** of this
21 subsection, each applicant for a senatorial scholarship shall:

22 (i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Office; and

23 (ii) 1. Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate,
24 graduate, or professional program at an eligible institution; or

25 2. Be enrolled in a 2–year terminal certificate program in
26 which the course work is acceptable for transfer credit for an accredited baccalaureate
27 program in an eligible institution.

28 (2) An applicant is exempt from the examination if the applicant:

29 (i) Is attending an eligible institution and has completed at least 1
30 year in good academic standing at the institution;

31 (ii) Graduated from high school at least 5 years before application
32 for a senatorial scholarship;

1 (iii) Is accepted for admission to a private career institution, if the
2 institution's curriculum is approved by the Commission, and the institution is accredited
3 by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of
4 Education; or

5 (iv) Is planning to attend or is attending a Maryland community
6 college.

7 **(3) AN APPLICANT IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF**
8 **PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE APPLICANT IS OR WAS ENROLLED IN A**
9 **CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM, COURSE, OR SEQUENCE OF COURSES AT A**
10 **COMMUNITY COLLEGE THAT LEADS TO CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE.**

11 18-405.

12 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a senatorial scholarship
13 may be used only at any **COMMUNITY COLLEGE OR** undergraduate, graduate, or
14 professional school in the State.

15 (b) A senatorial scholarship may be used:

16 (1) If the curriculum is approved by the Commission, at a degree granting
17 institution of higher education, a hospital diploma school for training registered nurses, or
18 to attend a private postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national
19 accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education as a
20 full-time student; and

21 (2) For educational expenses as defined by the Office, including:

22 (i) Tuition and mandatory fees; and

23 (ii) Room and board.

24 18-406.

25 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial
26 scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to §
27 18-406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient:

28 (1) Is a full-time student;

29 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and

30 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12
31 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate
32 student each semester leading to a degree.

1 (b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold
2 the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if the recipient:

3 (1) Is a part-time student;

4 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and

5 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6
6 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree.

7 (c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one-half of the yearly
8 award for summer school.

9 (d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate
10 program as provided in § [18-402(a)] **18-402(A)(1)** of this subtitle may hold the
11 scholarship for 2 years if [he] **THE RECIPIENT** is a full-time student and otherwise meets
12 the conditions of subsection (a) of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if
13 [he] **THE RECIPIENT** is a part-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of
14 subsection (b) of this section.

15 **(E) A RECIPIENT OF A SENATORIAL SCHOLARSHIP WHO IS CURRENTLY**
16 **ENROLLED, OR WAS ENROLLED WITHIN THE LAST 2 YEARS, IN A CERTIFICATE OR**
17 **LICENSE PROGRAM, COURSE, OR SEQUENCE OF COURSES AT A COMMUNITY**
18 **COLLEGE THAT LEADS TO CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE, AS PROVIDED IN §**
19 **18-402(A)(3) OF THIS SUBTITLE, MAY USE THE SCHOLARSHIP TO REIMBURSE**
20 **EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES AS DEFINED BY THE OFFICE UNDER § 18-405(B)(2) OF**
21 **THIS SUBTITLE.**

22 [(e)] **(F)** Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a private
23 postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting
24 association approved by the United States Department of Education:

25 (1) May hold the scholarship for the completion of one program if the
26 student otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)(1) and (2) of this section; and

27 (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the
28 institution for the completion of the program.

29 [(f)] **(G)** A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is an individual who is on
30 active duty with the United States military and otherwise meets the conditions of
31 subsection (a) or (b) of this section may be domiciled in this State rather than a resident of
32 this State.

1 (a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awarded
2 under this subtitle.

3 18–506.

4 (a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18–503 through
5 18–505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, during
6 each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal to four
7 times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full–time undergraduate student enrolled at the
8 University of Maryland, College Park Campus for the academic year commencing in that
9 year.

10 (b) A scholarship award under subsection (a) of this section:

11 (1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one–half of the
12 total amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) of this section for that year;

13 (2) Shall be used at an eligible institution;

14 (3) May be used by:

15 (i) A graduate, undergraduate, or professional student; [or]

16 (ii) A student at a private career school within the State that is
17 approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11–202 of this article
18 and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United
19 States Department of Education; [and] **OR**

20 **(III) A STUDENT WHO IS CURRENTLY ENROLLED OR WAS**
21 **ENROLLED IN THE LAST 2 YEARS IN A CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM, COURSE,**
22 **OR SEQUENCE OF COURSES AT A COMMUNITY COLLEGE THAT LEADS TO**
23 **CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE ~~AND IS, APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION,~~ AS**
24 **REIMBURSEMENT FOR EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES *THAT ARE DEFINED BY THE OFFICE***
25 ***AND INCLUDE TUITION, MANDATORY FEES, AND ROOM AND BOARD;* AND**

26 (4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be recredited to the
27 Delegate’s scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 months by that Delegate
28 to another student pursuant to this section.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
30 October 1, 2018.
