- 1 18–401. 2 There is a program of senatorial scholarships in this State that are awarded under 3 this subtitle. 18-402. 4 5 Except as provided in [paragraph] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of this (a) (1) 6 subsection, each applicant for a senatorial scholarship shall: 7 (i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Office; and 8 (ii) 1. Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate, 9 graduate, or professional program at an eligible institution; or 10 2. 28 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a senatorial scholarship 29 may be used only at any **COMMUNITY COLLEGE OR** undergraduate, graduate, or professional school in the State.

CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM AT A COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

(b) A senatorial scholarship may be used:

- 1 If the curriculum is approved by the Commission, at a degree granting (1) 2 institution of higher education, a hospital diploma school for training registered nurses, or 3 to attend a private postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national 4 accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education as a full-time student: and 5 6 (2)For educational expenses as defined by the Office, including: 7 (i) Tuition and mandatory fees; and 8 (ii) Room and board. 9 18–406. 10 Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial 11 scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to § 12 18–406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient: 13 Is a full–time student: (1) Continues to be a resident of this State: and 14 **(2)** 15 (3)Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12 16 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate 17 student each semester leading to a degree. 18 A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if the recipient: 19 20 (1) Is a part–time student; 21(2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and 22 Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6 23 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree. 24Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one—half of the yearly (c) 25award for summer school. 26 A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate 27 program as provided in § [18-402(a)] 18-402(A)(1) of this subtitle may hold the

- 10 (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the 11 institution for the completion of the program.
- [(f)] (G) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is an individual who is on active duty with the United States military and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a) or (b) of this section may be domiciled in this State rather than a resident of this State.

- 17 (a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awarded 18 under this subtitle.

- 20 (a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18–503 through 18–505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, during 22 each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal to four 23 times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full–time undergraduate student enrolled at the 24 University of Maryland, College Park Campus for the academic year commencing in that 25 year.

- 27 (1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one—half of the total amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) of this section for that year;

- 4 (III) A STUDENT WHO IS CURRENTLY ENROLLED OR WAS 5 ENROLLED IN THE LAST 2 YEARS IN A CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM AT A
- 6 COMMUNITY COLLEGE, APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION, AS REIMBURSEMENT FOR
- 7 EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES; AND
- 8 (4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be recredited to the
- 9 Delegate's scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 months by that Delegate
- 10 to another student pursuant to this section.
