A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Schools – Sprinkler Systems – Required**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a sprinkler system that meets certain requirements be
4 installed in each public school building in the State; providing for the application of
5 certain provisions of law; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to
6 sprinkler systems in public schools.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Education**

20 7–408.

21 (a) The State Superintendent shall require each county superintendent to hold a
22 fire drill in each public school in accordance with the State Fire Prevention Code
23 established under § 6–206 of the Public Safety Article.

24 (b) Each public school shall:

- 1 (1) Keep records of these fire drills; and
- 2 (2) Send a copy to the county superintendent.

3 (C) AS TO REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING SPRINKLER SYSTEMS IN PUBLIC
4 SCHOOL BUILDINGS, § 9-204 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE MAY APPLY.

5 **Article – Public Safety**

6 9-204.

7 (a) Each sprinkler system required under this section shall:

8 (1) be installed in accordance with accepted engineering practices that
9 meet the standard for the installation of sprinkler systems [in residential occupancies]
10 under the regulations of the State Fire Prevention Commission or the local authority with
11 jurisdiction over the enforcement of fire and building codes **IN:**

12 (I) **RESIDENTIAL OCCUPANCIES; OR**

13 (II) **PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS;**

14 (2) meet the requirements of the current National Fire Protection
15 Association standards; and

16 (3) be approved by the State Fire Marshal or the local authority with
17 jurisdiction over the enforcement of fire codes.

18 (b) (1) In a jurisdiction in which building permits are issued, a sprinkler
19 system shall be installed in:

20 (i) each newly constructed dormitory, hotel, lodging or rooming
21 house, or multifamily residential dwelling for which the initial building permit is issued on
22 or after July 1, 1990; [and]

23 (ii) each newly constructed town house for which the initial building
24 permit is issued on or after July 1, 1992; **AND**

25 (III) **EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING.**

26 (2) In a jurisdiction in which building permits are not issued, a sprinkler
27 system shall be installed in:

28 (i) each dormitory, hotel, lodging or rooming house, or multifamily
29 residential dwelling on which construction begins on or after July 1, 1990; [and]

1 (ii) each town house on which construction begins on or after July 1,
2 1992; AND

3 (III) EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING.

4 (c) If a dwelling unit is not serviced by a public water system, subsections (a) and
5 (b) of this section do not apply.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2018.
