Hospitals - Patient's Bill of Rights

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each administrator of a hospital to make a certain patient 4 bill of rights easily accessible to all patients and visitors; requiring each 5 administrator of a hospital to provide patients with offer to patients a certain 6 patient's bill of rights; requiring each administrator of a hospital to provide certain 7 patients with a translator, an interpreter, or another accommodation to provide 8 certain assistance to patients; requiring each administrator of a hospital to 9 conspicuously post copies of the patient's bill of rights on the hospital's website and in areas of the hospital accessible to patients; requiring each administrator of a 10 hospital to provide annual training to certain staff members to ensure the staff's 11 knowledge and understanding of the patient's bill of rights; requiring a certain 12 13 statement to be written in plain language; altering specifying the content of the rights that are required to be included addressed in a patient's bill of rights; 14 15 declaring the intent of the General Assembly; defining a certain term; making a 16 technical change; and generally relating to hospitals and a patient's bill of rights.
