Education – Healthy School Facility Fund – Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Healthy School Facility Fund as a special, nonlapsing 4 fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Interagency Committee on 5 School Construction to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold 6 the Fund and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the 7 Fund; specifying the purpose for which the Fund may be used; providing for the 8 investment of money in and expenditures from the Fund; requiring interest earnings 9 of the Fund to be credited to the Fund; specifying that money expended from the 10 Fund is supplemental to certain other funds; requiring the Governor to make a 11 certain appropriation in certain fiscal years to the Fund; requiring a certain priority 12 order in which the Interagency Committee on School Construction must allocate 13 funds; requiring the Interagency Committee on School Construction to establish certain application procedures; exempting the Fund from a certain provision of law 14 15 requiring interest earnings on State money to accrue to the General Fund of the 16 State; defining a certain term; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally 17 relating to the Healthy School Facility Fund.
