A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Baltimore County Board of Education – Voluntary Nonsectarian Prayer at School–Sponsored Student Events – Referendum

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Baltimore County Board of Education to allow certain $\mathbf{5}$ nonsectarian student-initiated voluntary prayer during certain school-sponsored 6 student events; providing that this Act does not diminish certain rights of certain 7 individuals relating to free speech and the free exercise of religion; providing that 8 the exercise of certain rights may not be construed as a certain support, approval, or 9 sanction of the contents of a certain prayer, as the promotion or establishment of a certain religion, or as an unconstitutional use of property by certain entities; 1011 providing for the purpose of this Act; providing for the application of this Act; 12defining a certain term; making the provisions of this Act severable; submitting this 13 Act to a referendum of the qualified voters of Baltimore County; and generally 14 relating to nonsectarian student-initiated voluntary prayer at school-sponsored events in Baltimore County. 15

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effective, it shall first be submitted to a referendum of the qualified voters of Baltimore 1 $\mathbf{2}$ County at the general election to be held in November 2018. The Baltimore County Council 3 and the Baltimore County Board of Elections shall do those things necessary and proper to 4 provide for and hold the referendum required by this section. If a majority of the votes cast on the question are "For the referred law" this Act shall become effective on the 30th day $\mathbf{5}$ 6 following the official canvass of votes for the referendum, but if a majority of the votes cast $\mathbf{7}$ on the question are "Against the referred law" this Act, with no further action required by 8 the General Assembly, shall be null and void.

9 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions of 10 Section 3 of this Act and for the sole purpose of providing for the referendum required by 11 Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
