A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Behavioral Health Crisis Response Grant Program – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Behavioral Health Crisis Response Grant Program; 4 providing for the purpose of the Program; requiring the Maryland Department of $\mathbf{5}$ Health to administer the Program; requiring the Program to award certain grants 6 to local behavioral health authorities to establish and expand certain behavioral 7 health crisis response programs and services; authorizing certain uses of funds 8 distributed under the Program; establishing that funds distributed under the 9 Program shall be used to supplement, and not supplant, certain other funding; 10 authorizing a local behavioral health authority to submit a certain proposal to the 11 Department; requiring the Department to award grants according to certain 12priorities; requiring certain recipients of funding under the Program to report certain 13 data to the Department; requiring the Department to establish certain application 14 procedures, a certain system of outcome measurement, and certain guidelines and 15procedures; requiring, for certain fiscal years, the Governor to include in the budget 16 bill certain appropriations for the Program; requiring, on or before a certain date 17each year, the Department to report to the Governor and the General Assembly; 18 defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Behavioral Health Crisis 19**Response Grant Program.**

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH 3 CRISIS RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM.

4 (B) (1) THERE IS A BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE GRANT 5 PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.

6 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO LOCAL 7 JURISDICTIONS TO ESTABLISH AND EXPAND COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH 8 CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEMS.

9 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM.

10 **(D) (1)** THE PROGRAM SHALL AWARD COMPETITIVE GRANTS TO LOCAL 11 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITIES TO ESTABLISH AND EXPAND BEHAVIORAL 12 HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES THAT:

13(I)SERVE LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS FOR CHILDREN,14ADULTS, AND OLDER ADULTS;

15 (II) MEET NATIONAL STANDARDS;

16 (III) INTEGRATE THE DELIVERY OF MENTAL HEALTH AND 17 SUBSTANCE USE TREATMENT; AND

18(IV)CONNECTINDIVIDUALSTOAPPROPRIATE19COMMUNITY-BASED CARE IN A TIMELY MANNER ON DISCHARGE.

20 (2) FUNDS DISTRIBUTED TO A LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH 21 AUTHORITY UNDER THE PROGRAM:

22 (I) MAY BE USED TO ESTABLISH OR EXPAND BEHAVIORAL 23 HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES, SUCH AS:

- 24 **1. MOBILE CRISIS TEAMS;**
- 25 2. ON-DEMAND WALK-IN SERVICES;
- 26 **3.** CRISIS RESIDENTIAL BEDS; AND

274.OTHER BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS PROGRAMS AND28SERVICES THAT THE DEPARTMENT CONSIDERS ELIGIBLE FOR PROGRAM FUNDS;

2 (II) SHALL BE USED TO SUPPLEMENT, AND NOT SUPPLANT, ANY
 3 OTHER FUNDING FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE PROGRAMS AND
 4 SERVICES.

5 (3) A LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITY MAY SUBMIT A 6 PROPOSAL REQUESTING PROGRAM FUNDING TO THE DEPARTMENT.

7 (4) IN AWARDING GRANTS UNDER THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT 8 SHALL PRIORITIZE PROPOSALS THAT:

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(I) MAKE USE OF MORE THAN ONE FUNDING SOURCE;

10(II) DEMONSTRATE EFFICIENCY IN SERVICE DELIVERY11THROUGH REGIONALIZATION, INTEGRATION OF THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS12PROGRAM OR SERVICE WITH EXISTING PUBLIC SAFETY AND EMERGENCY13RESOURCES, AND OTHER STRATEGIES TO ACHIEVE ECONOMIES OF SCALE; AND

14 (III) EVIDENCE A STRONG PLAN FOR INTEGRATION INTO THE 15 EXISTING BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SYSTEM OF CARE AND SUPPORTS TO PROVIDE 16 SEAMLESS AFTERCARE.

17 (5) FOR EACH SERVICE OR PROGRAM THAT RECEIVES FUNDING 18 UNDER THE PROGRAM, A LOCAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITY SHALL REPORT 19 TO THE DEPARTMENT ALL OUTCOME MEASUREMENT DATA REQUIRED BY THE 20 DEPARTMENT.
