2 County Boards of Education – Length of School Year – Adjustments

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a county board of education to extend the length of the school year for up to 5 days <u>and beyond a certain date</u> without approval from the State Board of Education; requiring a county board to submit a written application to the State Board for permission to increase the length of the school year for more than a certain number of school days in accordance with a certain provision of law or to decrease the length of the school year; and generally relating to adjustments to the length of the school year and county boards of education.

5 [(3)] (4) Education funding from State or local sources may not be 6 reduced if there are less than 180 school days in any year because of an approved 7 application under PARAGRAPH (1)(I)2 OF this subsection.

8 [(4)] (5) In case of emergency, the State Board may open schools on 9 holidays.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 11 1, 2018.
