1 AN ACT concerning

$\mathbf{2}$ Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - Hours of Sale - References to Park 3 **Heights Redevelopment Area**

4	FOR the purpose of creating an exception from hours of sale restrictions for certain alcoholic
5	beverages licenses issued for establishments in a certain area in Baltimore City;
6	altering the closing hour of sale for a certain license holder in a certain area of
7	Baltimore City; repealing certain references to the "Park Heights Redevelopment
8	Area"; altering the time during which establishments for which certain alcoholic
9	beverages licenses are issued in a certain area specified in the Park Heights Master
10	<u>Plan may sell alcoholic beverages; making a conforming change;</u> making this Act an
11	emergency measure; providing for the effective date of certain provisions of this Act;
12	and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Baltimore City.

4 (ii) The fee for the supplemental license is \$75 per issuance and is in 5 addition to the annual fee for the underlying Class D beer, wine, and liquor license.

6 (iii) A holder of a supplemental license shall notify the Board at least 7 2 weeks in advance of exercising the privileges under the supplemental license.

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take 9 effect July 1, 2018.

10 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 11 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 12 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 13 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and, except as provided in Section 3 of 14 this Act, shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
