1 AN ACT concerning

2 Task Force on the Regulation of Imposition of Sales Tax on Caterers

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on the Regulation of Caterers; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of 4 the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make 7 recommendations regarding the regulatory framework for caterers; requiring the 8 Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 9 General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this 10 Act; defining a certain term intent of the General Assembly regarding the 11 continuation of certain audits against certain caterers until a certain study is completed by the Comptroller; providing for the termination of this Act; and 12 generally relating to the Task Force on the Regulation of imposition of sales tax on 13Caterers caterers. 14

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That= it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Comptroller suspend audits of
17 caterers until the Office of the Comptroller completes its review of the interpretation of
18 Maryland tax rules and the taxation of catering companies.

19 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

20 (2) "Caterer" means a food service facility licensed under § 21–312.1 of the 21 Health – General Article that offers catering services or identifies itself as a cateror.
