- 1 (b) A payment of principal or interest on a specialty suspends the operation of 2 this section as to the specialty for three years after the date of payment.

- 5 (2) A deed of trust, mortgage, or promissory note that has been signed 6 under seal and secures or is secured by owner-occupied residential property, as defined in § 7–105.1 of the Real Property Article; **OR**
- 8 (3) A CONSUMER CONTRACT AS DEFINED IN § 5–101.1 OF THIS 9 SUBTITLE.
