WHEREAS, The Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland and the 13 14 Board of Governors of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center have entered into an agreement to design and construct on the campus of the Southern Maryland Higher 15 16 Education Center an 84,000-gross-square-foot education classroom and research facility that, under the auspices of the University System of Maryland, will attract and execute 17 basic and applied research into the vitally important and growing field of unmanned and 18 19 autonomous systems and technologies, as well as provide space for general and technical

- 20 education and instruction to the residents and businesses of the Southern Maryland region;
- 21and

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- WHEREAS, University System of Maryland institutions have an established presence at the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center, with five universities offering degree programs, at both the graduate and undergraduate levels in engineering, information technology, K-12 education, nursing, criminal justice, and social work; and
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WHEREAS, The Board of Governors and other stakeholders of the Southern

1 Maryland Higher Education Center have engaged closely with the leadership of the

- 2 University System of Maryland to develop a shared vision for a more fully-integrated
- 3 partnership combining the strength of the University System of Maryland's education,
- 4 research, technology transfer, and student service programs with the strong array of
- 5 advanced education and professional development services currently offered through the
- 6 Southern Maryland Higher Education Center in order to address the workforce and
- 7 economic needs and improve the quality of life enjoyed by the people and businesses of the
- 8 Southern Maryland region; and
- 9 WHEREAS, To advance this shared vision, and create an unparalleled resource that 10 promises to have a transformational impact on the further development of the advanced
- 11 technology and innovation economy of the Southern Maryland region—and the concomitant
- 12 highly-skilled, highly-educated workforce needed to drive such an economy—the Board of
- 13 Governors of the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center and the University System
- 14 of Maryland will soon have agreed through a memorandum of understanding to merge the
- 15 Southern Maryland Higher Education Center and all its assets with the University System
- of Maryland to become the newest regional higher education center; now, therefore,
- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Education
- [Subtitle 3. Southern Maryland Higher Education Center.]
- 21 [24–301.
- 22 (a) In this subtitle the following terms have the meanings indicated.
- 23 (b) "Board" means the Board of Governors of the Southern Maryland Higher 24 Education Center.
- 25 (c) "Center" means the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center.
- 26 (d) "Commission" means the Maryland Higher Education Commission.]
- 27 [24–302.
- There is a Southern Maryland Higher Education Center that is governed by a Board of Governors.
- 30 [24–303.
- 31 (a) The Board consists of 13 voting members appointed by the Governor.
- 32 (b) The Governor shall appoint at least two members each from St. Mary's,

Charles, and Calvert counties. 1 2 Each member serves for a term of 4 years and until a successor is 3 appointed and qualifies. 4 (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 1994. 5 6 A member may not serve more than two full consecutive terms. (3)7 **(4)** A member appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term serves only 8 for the remainder of that term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies. 9 (d) The Governor shall appoint one of the voting members to act as chair. (1) 10 (2)The voting members may elect other officers and establish committees, 11 including advisory committees, as needed. 12 In addition to the 13 voting members, the following individuals shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting members: 13 14 (1)The commanding officer of the Naval Air Warfare Center – Aircraft 15 Division at Patuxent River, or the commanding officer's designee; 16 A member of the St. Mary's County Building Authority recommended (2)17 by the St. Mary's County Board of County Commissioners; and 18 (3)A representative of the Tri-County Council for Southern Maryland. 19 (f) Each member of the Board: 20 (1) Serves without compensation; and 21Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses in accordance with the Standard State Travel Regulations. 2223 **[**24–304. 24In addition to the other powers expressly granted and duties imposed by this 25title, and subject to the authority of the Commission, the Board has only the powers and 26 duties set forth in this section. 27 (b) The Board shall:

Exercise general control over the Center;

Keep separate records and minutes; and

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- 1 (3) Adopt reasonable rules, regulations, or bylaws to carry out the 2 provisions of this subtitle.
- 3 (c) The Board may fix the salaries and terms of employment of the Director and 4 other employees of the Center.
- 5 (d) The Board may purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire any property it considers 6 necessary for the operation of the Center, with the approval of the St. Mary's County Board 7 of County Commissioners.
- 8 (e) (1) The Board may sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of Center assets or 9 property, with the approval of the St. Mary's County Board of County Commissioners.
- 10 (2) The Director of the Center or the chair of the Board may execute a conveyance or other legal document under an appropriate resolution of the Board.
- 12 (f) The Board shall ensure that all academic programs and policies of the Center 13 are in compliance with the policies of and approved by the Commission.
- 14 (g) The Board shall submit an adopted mission statement to the Commission subject to the policies and guidelines of the Commission.
- 16 (h) The Board may enter into contracts or other agreements with any institution 17 of higher education for the provision of upper division undergraduate and graduate 18 programs to meet the higher education needs of Southern Maryland, subject to the approval 19 of the Commission.
- 20 (i) The Board may apply, accept, and expend any gift, appropriation, or grant 21 from the State, county, or federal government or any other person.
- 22 (j) (1) The Board shall ensure that the tuition and fees charged to students by 23 any participating institutions are reasonable.
- 24 (2) The Board may also charge reasonable fees to cover the overhead costs associated with providing these programs.
- 26 (k) The Board may sue and be sued.
- 27 (l) The Board may make agreements with the federal, State, or county 28 governments or any other person, if it considers the agreement advisable for the operation 29 of the Center.
- 30 (m) The Board may adopt a corporate seal.
- 31 (n) In addition to other reports that may be required by the Commission, the 32 Board shall:

1 (1)Keep records that are consistent with sound business practices and 2 accounting records using generally accepted accounting principles; 3 (2)Cause an audit by an independent certified public accountant to be 4 made of the accounts and transactions of the Center at the conclusion of each fiscal year; 5 and 6 For any State moneys, be subject to an audit by the Office of Legislative 7 Audits, in accordance with §§ 2–1220 through 2–1227 of the State Government Article. 8 (o) The Board shall enter into an agreement with St. Mary's County to establish 9 guidelines for the use and operation of the Center.] 10 [24–305. 11 (a) The Board shall appoint a Director of the Center. The Director shall: 12(b) 13 (1) Report directly to the Board; 14 Recommend the appointment by the Board of employees necessary for (2)the efficient administration of the Center; 15 16 Recommend the discharge of employees for good cause and in accordance with applicable laws and policies; 17 Be responsible to the Board for the conduct of the Center and for its 18 19 administration and supervision; 20(5)Attend all meetings of the Board, except those involving the Director's personal position; 2122 (6) Subject to the policies and guidelines of the Commission: 23 (i) Develop a mission statement; 24Submit the mission statement to the Board of Governors of the (ii) 25Center; and 26 Upon the direction of the Board of Governors, update the mission (iii) 27 statement every 4 years; and 28 Perform other duties as assigned by the Board. (7)

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- The budget of the Center, as developed by the Board, shall: 1 (a) 2 (1) Be submitted to the Commission for informational purposes; and 3 **(2)** Include personnel detail. 4 (b) Requests for appropriations for operating expenses from St. Mary's, Calvert, or Charles counties shall be made to the appropriate Board of County Commissioners in 5 6 accordance with: 7 (1) Applicable county procedures and requirements; or 8 (2) An agreement with the Board of County Commissioners. 9 Requests for State appropriations for specific projects shall be submitted to 10 the Commission. 11 Proposals for capital projects, either new or substantial changes to existing 12 projects, shall be submitted to the State Department of Budget and Management through the Commission. 13 14 The major functions established by the Commission shall generally conform 15 to those contained in the current College and University Industry Audit Guide issued by 16 the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. [24–307. 17 The Boards of County Commissioners of St. Mary's, Calvert, and Charles 18 19 counties may appropriate money to pay the cost of establishing and operating the Center, 20 including the establishment of a reserve fund for maintenance and repair. 21The expenditure of appropriated funds shall be consistent with all relevant (b) 22State laws.] 23[24–308. 24If the Board of Governors of the Center conveys any real property in whole or (a) 25in part, the proceeds of the disposition shall be shared between St. Mary's County and the 26 State in such proportions as each has contributed to the capital investment in the property.
 - (b) That disposition shall be in accordance with all terms and conditions of the original conveyance of the property to St. Mary's County Board of County Commissioners and the Board of Public Works shall enter into an agreement providing for the calculation of the amount due to each party under this section.
 - (c) The payment to the State shall be made by the county within 90 days of the

- 1 date of receipt of any proceeds.]

- 3 (a) (1) The Board may carry comprehensive liability insurance to protect the 4 Board, its agents, and employees.
- 5 (2) The purchase of the insurance is for an educational purpose and is a 6 valid educational expense.
- 7 (b) (1) The Board may adopt standards for the policies, including a minimum 8 liability coverage that may not be less than \$100,000 per occurrence.
- 9 (2) Any policy purchased after the adoption of these standards shall 10 conform to them.
- 11 (c) The Board complies with this section if it is self—insured, for at least \$100,000 and not more than \$500,000 per occurrence, under the rules and regulations of the State Insurance Commissioner.
- 14 (d) This section does not prevent the Board, on its own behalf, from raising the 15 defense of sovereign immunity to any amount of a claim in excess of the limit of an 16 insurance policy or in excess of \$100,000 in the case of self-insurance.]
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
