### 1 AN ACT concerning

# State Department of Education – REAL School Gardens Pilot Program – Established

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the REAL School Gardens Pilot Program; specifying the  $\mathbf{5}$ purpose of the Program; requiring certain <del>counties</del> jurisdictions to implement the 6 Program; requiring the State Department of Education to administer the Program 7 in coordination with REAL School Gardens; requiring the Governor's proposed 8 budget for a certain fiscal year to appropriate a certain amount to the Department 9 to be used only for the Program; requiring the Department to obtain the services of 10 an independent third party to conduct a certain review on or before a certain date; 11 requiring the Department to submit the results of the review to the Governor and 12the General Assembly on or before a certain date; requiring the Department, in 13 coordination with REAL School Gardens, to prepare a certain progress report for 14 certain years of the Program; specifying the contents of the progress report; requiring 15the Department to submit the progress report to the Governor and the General 16 Assembly on or before certain dates; defining a certain term; providing for the 17termination of this Act; and generally relating to the REAL School Gardens Pilot 18 Program.

6 (I) THE PROGRAM'S EXPENDITURES FOR THE PREVIOUS 7 FISCAL YEAR;

8 (II) THE PROGRAM'S TOTAL EXPENDITURES TO DATE;
9 (III) THE PROGRAM'S IMPACT ON STUDENT LEARNING; AND
10 (IV) THE EFFECTIVENESS OF TEACHERS' USE OF OUTDOOR

12 (3) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2021, AND DECEMBER 31, 2022, 13 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT THE PROGRESS REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, 14 IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE 15 GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 17 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2023, 18 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and 19 of no further force and effect.
