CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Safety - 9-1-1 Public Safety Telecommunicators - Benefits

FOR the purpose of expanding the eligibility for the Edward T. and Mary A. Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program to include certain 9-1-1 public safety telecommunicators and certain eligible dependents of 9-1-1 public safety telecommunicators; authorizing the governing body of a county to grant, by law, certain death benefits and funeral benefits for certain 9-1-1 public safety telecommunicators; authorizing the governing body of a county to provide, by law, for certain matters: authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City or the governing body of a county or of a municipal corporation to grant a certain property tax credit for certain 9-1-1 public safety telecommunicators in the county or municipal corporation where the individuals reside; providing that the credit may not exceed a certain amount per dwelling and the amount of property tax imposed on the dwelling: requiring the State Department of Assessments and Taxation to be responsible for certain administrative duties relating to the credit; requiring a county or municipal corporation to reimburse the Department for certain administrative costs; authorizing the governing body of a county or municipal corporation to provide, by law, for certain matters relating to the tax credit; defining a certain term; altering certain definitions; providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to benefits for 9-1-1 public safety telecommunicators.
