13 14	(a) In §§ 14–801 through 14–854 of this subtitle, the following words have the meanings indicated.
15 16 17	(b) "Other taxing agency" means any municipal corporation or other public or quasi-public corporation that may impose a tax of any kind which is or may become a lier on real property.
18 19 20	(c) "Owner-occupied residential property" means, with respect to a property located in Baltimore City, the principal residence of a homeowner as defined in 9–105(a)(7) of this article.
21 22 23	(d) (1) "Tax" means any tax, or charge of any kind due to the State or any of its political subdivisions, or to any other taxing agency, that by law is a lien against the real property on which it is imposed or assessed.
24	(2) "Tax" includes interest, penalties, and service charges.

26 27 28 29 30	(a) (1) Except for property that has been transferred by a municipality of county to a land bank authority established under § 1–1403 of the Local Governmen Article, AND EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER § 14–811 OF THIS SUBTITLE, the collector shall proceed to sell and shall sell under this subtitle, at the time required by local law but in no case, except in Baltimore City, later than 2 years from the date the tax is in arrears all property in the county in which the collector is elected or appointed on which the tax is
