- WHEREAS, Sports can be a vehicle for physical fitness and positive personal growth; and

WHEREAS, Those involved in sports, including coaches, players, and fans at all levels, should promote good sportsmanship and foster the development of positive characteristics in all individuals; and

1 WHEREAS, Players will have an equal opportunity to strive for success and can 2 trust that they will be treated with dignity; and

3 WHEREAS, Elements of sportsmanship reflect crucial life skills that will help 4 players thrive throughout elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education; and

5 WHEREAS, A strong sense of character and collaboration can also prepare athletes 6 for the workplace; and

WHEREAS, Sportsmanship can combat bullying and promote inclusion by providing
a safe and healthy environment where players value respect, fairness, integrity,
responsibility, and perseverance; and

10 WHEREAS, Respect is treating others the way you want to be treated, tolerating 11 differences, considering the feelings of others, dealing peacefully with anger, insults, and 12 disagreements, and taking care of the environment; and

WHEREAS, Fairness is playing by the rules, being open-minded, listening to others,
 not taking advantage of others, and taking personal responsibility for mistakes; and

WHEREAS, Integrity is playing with honor, being humble in victory and graceful in defeat, being truthful and trustworthy, having the courage to do the right thing, being reliable, building a good reputation, and being loyal to your team and coaches; and

18 WHEREAS, Responsibility is doing what is expected of you, being self-disciplined, 19 thinking before you act, considering the consequences of your actions, and being 20 accountable for your choices; and

21 WHEREAS, Perseverance is always doing your best, demonstrating a positive 22 attitude, and never giving up; and

WHEREAS, Fostering these qualities on the playing field can prevent harassment and reduce incidents of concussions and other injuries; and

WHEREAS, Those who demonstrate sportsmanship are invaluable because they create a domino effect by setting a positive tone for others to emulate in their schools and communities; and

WHEREAS, A positive tone can increase the rankings of our schools, enhance the atmosphere of our municipalities, and serve as a conduit for economic development, drawing businesses to our State; and

31 WHEREAS, A number of local recreation and parks departments across the State 32 have successfully implemented sportsmanship months at the local level; and

33 WHEREAS, It is critical that good sportsmanship be developed and recognized in

order to ensure a quality sports environment for all involved; now, therefore, 1 $\mathbf{2}$ SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 3 That Section(s) 7–503 through 7–506, respectively, of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-504 through 7-507, 4 respectively. $\mathbf{5}$ 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read 7 as follows: 8 **Article – General Provisions** 9 7-503. 10 THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF MARCH (A) 11 AS MARYLAND SPORTSMANSHIP MONTH. 12**(B)** (1) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE LOCAL RECREATION AND PARKS DEPARTMENTS IN THE STATE TO OBSERVE MARYLAND SPORTSMANSHIP 1314 MONTH PROPERLY WITH APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES. 15(2) **APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES MAY** 16 **INCLUDE:** 17**(I)** RECOGNITION OF PLAYERS, PARENTS, COACHES, AND 18 VOLUNTEERS WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED EXEMPLARY SPORTSMANSHIP IN LOCAL 19 **ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES;** 20**(II)** SKILL DEVELOPMENT SESSIONS FOR PLAYERS; 21(III) CERTIFICATION AND TRAINING SESSIONS FOR COACHES; 22AND 23(IV) RECOGNITION OF VOLUNTEER CONTRIBUTIONS AND 24PARENT COMMITMENTS THAT ARE KEY TO PROVIDING EVERY CHILD A CHANCE TO 25**EXPERIENCE SPORTS.** 26SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27October 1, 2018.
