A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Health – Opioids – Dispensing Requirement**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a drug classified as an opioid to be dispensed with a nontoxic
4 composition designed to permanently and chemically sequester or deactivate the
5 drug and be used for disposal of the drug; establishing that a certain provision of this
6 Act does not relieve a person from certain requirements of law regarding controlled
7 dangerous substances; and generally relating to the dispensing of opioids.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Health – General**

21 **21–221.1.**

22 **A DRUG THAT IS CLASSIFIED AS AN OPIOID SHALL BE DISPENSED WITH A**

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 NONTOXIC COMPOSITION DESIGNED TO:

2 (1) PERMANENTLY AND CHEMICALLY SEQUESTER OR DEACTIVATE
3 THE DRUG; AND

4 (2) BE USED TO DISPOSE OF ANY UNUSED, UNWANTED, OR EXPIRED
5 PORTION OF THE DRUG.

7 Nothing in § 21–220, § 21–221, or [§ 21–221] § 21–221.1 of this subtitle relieves
8 any person from any requirement imposed by law with respect to any drug that is classified
9 as a controlled dangerous substance within the meaning of Title 5 of the Criminal Law
10 Article or the applicable federal law.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2018.
