Nothing in § 21–220, § 21–221, or [§ 21–221] § 21–221.1 of this subtitle relieves
any person from any requirement imposed by law with respect to any drug that is classified
as a controlled dangerous substance within the meaning of Title 5 of the Criminal Law
Article or the applicable federal law.
