A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Dentistry Act - Scope of Practice and Penalties for Violations

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from being considered to be practicing dentistry 4 or violating certain provisions of law based solely on whether the person provides 5 certain services or engages in certain acts; providing that certain provisions of law 6 do not prohibit a dentist or dental practice from contracting to receive or receiving 7 certain services or benefiting from certain acts; prohibiting the State Board of Dental Examiners from prohibiting a person from contracting to provide certain services or 8 9 engaging in certain acts, or a dentist or a dental practice from contracting to receive 10 or receiving certain services or benefiting from certain acts; prohibiting a person 11 from aiding or abetting the unauthorized practice of dentistry in the State; altering 12 certain penalties for certain acts related to the unauthorized practice of dentistry; 13 altering certain penalties for violating certain provisions of law related to dental 14 laboratory work or advertising a dental appliance; providing for the application of 15 certain provisions of this Act; repealing certain provisions of law that specify certain 16 places of imprisonment; defining a certain term; altering a certain definition; and 17 generally relating to the scope of practice of dentistry and penalties for violations of 18 the Maryland Dentistry Act.



 - (c) (1) On written request and good cause shown by the heir or personal representative of a deceased licensed dentist, including evidence of a good faith effort to sell or close the dental practice, the Board, in its sole discretion, may extend the 1-year period under subsection (b)(6)(iii) of this section for up to an additional 6 months to allow the heir

- 1 or personal representative sufficient time to sell or otherwise dispose of the dental practice.
- 2 (2) During the temporary ownership of a dental practice by an heir or a representative of a deceased licensed dentist under subsection (b)(6)(iii) of this section and, if applicable, paragraph (1) of this subsection, all patient care shall be provided:
- 5 (i) By an appropriate individual who is licensed under this title; and
- 6 (ii) In accordance with the individual's scope of practice.
- 7 (3) The temporary ownership of a dental practice by an heir or a personal 8 representative of a deceased licensed dentist under this subsection may not affect the 9 exercise of the independent judgment of a licensed dentist who provides care to patients of the dental practice.
- 11 (D) A PERSON MAY NOT BE CONSIDERED TO BE PRACTICING DENTISTRY OR 12 VIOLATING THIS TITLE BASED SOLELY ON WHETHER THE PERSON:
- 13 (1) Owns, leases, or otherwise provides, or contracts to Own, lease, or otherwise provide, any asset used by a licensed dentist or

- 24 (5) PROVIDES CONSULTING SERVICES, FINANCIAL SERVICES, OR ANY 25 OTHER SERVICES OR ACTIVITIES RELATING TO THE PRODUCTIVITY, EFFICIENCY, 26 AND COST MANAGEMENT OF A DENTAL PRACTICE THAT DO NOT INCLUDE THE 27 PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY; OR
- 28 (6) RECEIVES FEES FOR GOODS OR SERVICES PROVIDED TO A 29 DENTIST OR A DENTAL PRACTICE THAT ARE AGREED TO BY THE DENTIST OR THE
- 30 OWNER OF THE DENTAL PRACTICE, INCLUDING FEES THAT ARE CALCULATED BASED

- 1 (E) (1) THIS TITLE DOES NOT PROHIBIT A DENTIST OR A DENTAL 2 PRACTICE FROM CONTRACTING TO RECEIVE OR RECEIVING SERVICES OR 3 BENEFITING FROM ACTS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION.
- 4 (2) THE BOARD MAY NOT PROHIBIT:
- 5 (I) A PERSON FROM CONTRACTING TO PROVIDE OR ENGAGING 6 IN A SERVICE OR AN ACT SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION; OR

- 10 (c) A person who violates any provision of Subtitle 4 of this title, which relates to dental laboratory work, or who advertises a dental appliance in violation of § 4–503(c) of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$2,000] \$3,000 PER DAY or imprisonment [in jail] not exceeding [6] 18 months.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
