House Bill 950 Economic Matters (Delegate Reilly)

Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Polling Places on Election Days

This bill prohibits a license holder in Harford County, whose premises are used as a polling place, from exercising any privilege conferred by the license on the day of an election when the polls are open. The bill takes effect July 1, 2018.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The bill is not anticipated to materially impact Harford County finances or operations. Any additional enforcement activity can be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: Minimal overall, but any license holder whose premises are used as a polling place may experience a decrease in alcoholic beverages sales revenue on the day of an election.

Analysis

Current Law: Statute does not prohibit a license holder whose premises are also used as a polling place from exercising any privilege conferred by the license when the polls are open.

Background: In fiscal 2017, 202 alcoholic beverages licenses were issued for use in Harford County.
