10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Greater Baltimore Urban League (GBUL) was founded in 1924 to assist migrants from the rural south to adapt to urban life, address discrimination, and overcome civil and human rights challenges. GBUL led multiple efforts to open opportunities and integrate institutions, including the Baltimore City Fire Department, The University of Maryland, Baltimore Medical Society, and the Baltimore Emergency Relief Commission. Complementing its advocacy work are GBUL programs. Youth Empowerment Programs foster college and career readiness, positive cultural-identity, and community leadership. The Raymond V. Haysbert Sr. Center for Entrepreneurship provides technical assistance to new and growing micro- and small business owners. GBUL outreach activities, convenings, and collaborations span the breadth of GBUL issues including health, education, and employment.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Installed as a new system in 1992, the HVAC system suffered two blows in 2011. First, a tree fell on one unit, permanently disabling it. The second unit was vandalized and stripped of mechanical components, copper and electrical parts. Initial repairs, conducted largely through pro-bono efforts, are only partial and energy inefficient. Parts of the HVAC system are work intermittently and monthly bills can exceed \$5,000. The proposed project, when coupled with window repairs and insulation, will provide a long-term comprehensive energy-efficient solution. The project will replace: 1) a condensing unit; 2) upgrade BMS controls; 3) a compressor on a condensing unit; 4) motor starter with VFDs on AHUs; 5) ATC wiring (as needed). Whiting Turner is serving as a pro-bono general contractor for the project.

28. Comments
In 1992, the Orchard Street Church, the oldest standing structure in Baltimore built by African-Americans, was given new life as the headquarters of the Greater Baltimore Urban League (GBUL). GBUL brought together city and state actors and historic preservationists to rescue the historic Orchard Street Church from 17 years of vacancy returning it to service as a community hub with a \$3.7 million restoration. GBUL hosts tours, reenactments, and living history presentations that bring the Orchard Street Churchs story to life for hundreds of students, tourists, and history enthusiasts. The Orchard Street Church is a living community center, housing GBULs administrative offices, classrooms, and community meeting space. The building, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, dates to 1825/1837. Always associated with a highly engaged congregation, the Orchard Street Church building is widely believed to be a stop on the Underground Railroad.
