<p>The Rotary Club of Salisbury Foundation, Inc. supports the activities of the Rotary Club of Salisbury. These include weekly meetings and projects that have enhanced our local, regional, and global community with monetary donations and volunteer efforts. They exemplify Rotary's motto of Service Above Self. For example for the past several years we distributed locally over \$65,000 annually and constructed nearly 20 wheel chair ramps for people and worship centers in need. Globally we supported well water construction projects in Romania and Africa. The projects benefit all age groups. The club supported young people through our over 60 year commitment to scouting and the distribution of dictionaries to all 3rd graders in Wicomico County. We supported senior citizens by distributing more than 2,500 Meals on Wheels annually for local home bound seniors.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

To celebrate the Rotary Club of Salisbury's centennial, the club plans to construct a labyrinth for peace in Downtown Salisbury. The labyrinth is similar to the one in Chartres Cathedral and will be the 6th Rotary labyrinth in the world. Once established it will be a proactive way to reduce conflict and promote peace in our community. The labyrinth will provide "a space leading to mutual respect, strengthening relationships, and increasing tolerance..while decreasing aggression...conflict." It will be a space for: The Salisbury Police to positively interact with the students whom they mentor, teach, and coach, and who participate in the Law Enforcement Explorer Post. The Department of Conflict Analysis and Dispute Resolution at Salisbury University to utilize for class activities. The school system and other organizations to use for community circles which build community and respond to harm. The community to hold memorial events, such as 9/11.

<p>The City of Salisbury is allowing the Rotary Club of Salisbury to establish a labyrinth on this property. The labyrinth will be located outdoors. Its radius is 36 feet and its circumference is 72 feet. It will be constructed using random flat paving stones. Paths will be 2 feet wide with 2 foot grass separation. In the center there will be park bench seating and tree/grate. There will also be several signs near the entrance of the labyrinth.</p> <p>There are no operating costs other than maintenance. The Rotary Club of Salisbury and the City of Salisbury will maintain that space.</p> <p>We are at the beginning of a fund raising campaign.</p> <p>The response to 11 identified several ways the labyrinth can be utilized to promote peace and reduce conflict. It can be used in other ways as well. For example, it will be space for the Rotary Club of Salisbury to co-sponsor new events such as International Day of Peace and World Labyrinth Day. Both events bring people together and can be used to recognize the efforts of people who have worked hard to end conflict and promote peace. It will be space to teach Tai Chi and Capoeira (Brazilian martial arts). And, it is a space where anyone can contemplate, meditate, and reflect.</p>
