House Bill 91

(Delegates Grammer and Adams)

Environment and Transportation

### **Natural Resources - Hunting - Outerwear Exception**

This bill exempts a person hunting on his/her own property (with or without a hunting license) from the requirement to wear specified fluorescent orange clothing while hunting. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2018.** 

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None. The bill does not affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: None. The bill does not affect local government operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

### Analysis

**Current Law/Background:** Generally, hunters (and those who accompany, aid, or assist them) must wear (1) a cap of a solid daylight fluorescent orange color or (2) a vest, jacket, or outer garment that contains specified amounts of the daylight fluorescent orange color. These requirements do not apply to (1) deer hunters using a bow and arrow during bow season; (2) hunters using falcons, hawks, or owls during open season; and (3) hunters (and those who accompany, aid, or assist them) hunting specified species.

Traditionally a person hunting on his/her own property was exempt from the requirement to wear daylight fluorescent orange while hunting. However, Chapter 102 of 2017 repealed this exemption.
