### 10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Historical Society of Harford County, Inc. collects, preserves, promotes and interprets the rich and diverse history of the Harford County area in its regional context from its prehistoric origins to the present for the education and enjoyment of current and future generations. Its motto is "Preserving Our Past For Your future."

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Historical Society of Harford County, Inc. is entering the third phase of its preservation project. Work continues to repair and restore the Society's headquarters building, a 1936 Works Progress Administration era structure, originally built as the Bel Air Post Office. Among the projects in this phase are: continuation of exterior repairs and renovations to the structure, conversion of the basement level area of the building from utilitarian/mechanical space to climate controlled storage/work areas, flooring repairs and interior woodwork restoration. Also included is Phase II of the museum design plan, replacement of the non-historically accurate entryway & continued interior repairs and renovations.

#### 28. Comments

The Historical Society of Harford County, Inc. is the oldest local historical society in the state. Founded in 1885, the Society led a vagabond existence headquartered in various nonowned sites until 1994 when it was given its present site. The 1936 WPA era building was deeded to the Society in compromised physical condition as prior owners had not taken the care to preserve the building. Since owning the building the Society has worked to make major repairs in order to return it to its original Colonial Revival-style design. To date the Society has completed exterior repairs to the stone walls and roof line in order to prevent water infiltration. It has repaired and repainted the signature cupola and installed a new roof. It has performed extensive asbestos abatement prior to the installation of a new first floor heating and air conditioning system and has made safety and energy efficiency upgrades to its lighting and electrical system. Interior painting and plaster work have also been performed in some areas of the building.

This work has been performed with previous help from the State as well as from private foundations,

Society fundraising events and individual contributions. Interior repairs to the meeting area have allowed the Society to institute a new monthly free lecture series, added evening research hours and evening monthly genealogical classes. With continued improvements to the building we expect the amount of public traffic to continue to increase. Our goal is to create a sought out regional historic destination that attracts a range of residents, tourists and researchers encouraging repeat visits. At present, although much has been accomplished, there is still much to be done.

The Society has grown significantly over the past 16 years and the public traffic through the building, added to increased online, mail and social media traffic has created a great demand for the services the Society supplies including local, regional, national and international requests for information.

The Society's paper collections are available to the public however, the majority of its three-dimensional items are in storage due to the lack of a secure, modern, museum quality display area.

Among the projects to be addressed with funds from the bond is the second phase of the Society's museum space design. The Society's goal is to make the immense artifact collection more accessible and to expose visitors to never before seen artifacts. We aim to tell the Harford County story and create new dialogues through a unique and inspiring visitor experience by converting the highly visible interior front area of the building into an interactive museum display area which will allow for the greater portion of the Society's artifacts collection to be brought into public view.
