<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)							

The Annapolis Maritime Museum & Park (AMMP) educates youth and adults about the area's rich maritime heritage and the ecology of the Chesapeake Bay through programs, exhibits, and community events. We accomplish this mission through a suite of hands-on programming offered at two unique locations, both on Back Creek. Founded in 1990, the AMMP provides a critical link between our region's past, centered on the maritime industry and the Chesapeake Bay, and the present, which continues to be defined by our deep connection to the waters of the largest estuary in the nation. The AMMP educates 10,000 students annually and attracts more than 50,000 locals and visitors alike to its campus through public programs, special events, and exhibits.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

The Waterworks project includes the design, construction, and renovation of the historic 1934 Waterworks building, a 3,025 square foot historic structure at the museum's second campus, the Back Creek Nature Park (BCNP). The Museum will rehabilitate the derelict structure making it an active environmental teaching lab, educational facility, and offices. The Waterworks building is an integral part of the Park Master Plan to restore the BCNP, transforming it into an active center that engages the community and visitors with the heritage and ecology of the Chesapeake Bay. The BCNP will serve 25,000 people annually, including 10,000 public school students from throughout the State. At this waterfront setting, in-depth educational experiences will provide insight into the maritime history of Annapolis and inspire environmental stewardship.

## 28. Comments

The Annapolis Maritime Museum & Park (AMMP) is a vital anchor and leader in the community. With historic exhibits managed by an onsite Museum Curator and housed in a waterfront educational facility, the AMMP is a dynamic institution that is in daily use for visitors, classes, lectures, concerts, and community meetings. Our unique facilities and knowledgeable staff provide a deeper understanding of our regions maritime past and enduring connection to the Chesapeake Bay. Exploring and understanding the waters of the largest estuary in the nation catalyzes our visitors to become environmental leaders and stewards with an expanded understanding of the natural world.

In 2016, AMMP signed a lease with the City of Annapolis for the Ellen O. Moyer Nature Park at Back Creek, now known as the Back Creek Nature Park Campus (BCNP). This 12acre waterfront park will become a major Education Center that will accommodate our expanding programs and allow us to provide additional hands-on activities. The deteriorating Waterworks building will be transformed into a vibrant center that will provide a platform for programs that educate, excite, and engage students and adults alike.

The Waterworks building will include classroom and lecture areas, a wet lab, education staff offices, a service kitchen, and functional, multipurpose storage. Classroom spaces will be designed with flexibility in mind and will be suitable for use with a variety of ages from Pre-K through adult. Classrooms will accommodate 80 seated participants and feature state-of-the-art audio/visual equipment. The wet lab will be suitable for groups of up to 20 students and is designed to engage students with the aquatic environment. This space will feature lab equipment, aquariums, and hands-on learning materials. Education Center staff will have on-site offices to assist with the facilitation of learning experiences at the BCNP.

The improvements to the Waterworks building at the BCNP will allow AMMP to offer expanded educational programming that includes: middle and high school programs; a significant expansion of our core programs for Pre-K, second grade, and sixth grade students; additional professional development opportunities for teachers; summer camps; and programs for adults and the public.

In addition, the historic building and urban park will serve as an innovative public space, not only as a platform for learning but as a place for gathering and an invitation to connect with nature, fostering a long-term commitment to the community and the environment.
