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10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Fort Meade Alliance (FMA) and Fort Meade Alliance Foundation (FMAF) are committed to our veterans, military personnel, Dept. of Defense civilians and their families in the region. Our mission is to support and promote Fort Meade as an economic asset and resource to the region. The FMAF, a nonprofit organization, is the charitable arm of the team and is charged with generating revenue to support the mission.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The renovation of Kuhn Hall on the Fort Meade base will create a new 9,000 square foot Resiliency and Education Center to help soldiers, veterans, Department of Defense civilians and their families connect to resources and empower them to be the best that they can be. The new center will connect Fort Meade community members to wellness programs, mental health services, education & transition services, substance abuse counseling, and legal assistance. As the first designated check-in facility for new families, it will provide navigator services for transitioning military and their families to link to area schools, housing and other services.

Kuhn Hall will offer a single location for veterans, service members, their families, and DoD civilians to learn about resources that support resiliency both within the fence of Fort Meade and in the surrounding community. The building will be staffed by a Resiliency resource person who will greet each visitor. This staff person will be a member of the Installations Community Health Promotion Council and will report to the Personnel Management Division. S/he will schedule classes and programs that support resiliency, answer questions, and instruct the visitor how to use the Resiliency Kiosk, an interactive touch-screen information interface that allows private searches for services on base and off.

Kuhn Hall will link community members to: Wellness Center, Health Clinics, Fitness Centers, USO, Community Readiness Center, Child, Youth & School Services, Relationship Support, Education & Transition Services, Legal Assistance, Army Substance Abuse Program, and Army Community Services. Existing clubs such as the Officers Spouses Club (OSC), the Enlisted Spouses Club (ESC), the Better Opportunity for Single Soldiers (BOSS) Group will offer activities at Kuhn Hall. The BOSS will use the teaching kitchen in Kuhn Hall to teach young soldiers how to prepare healthy meals. The OSC and ESC will host roundtable discussions on deployment-readiness, preparing children to move to another Post, etc.

The Fort Meade Alliances Military and Family committee has established partnerships with groups such as American Red Cross, Kennedy Krieger Institute and others to provide the following:

Substance abuse and alcohol prevention programs

Alcoholics Anonymous meetings and spouse support groups

Suicide prevention workshops

Family Advocacy Programs, including New Parent Support groups

Nutritional cooking classes

Financial literacy training

Army Community Service Resources

Community Services Outreach Fairs

Career Skills Program industry internship program for transitioning service members Employment resume writing, interview skills

Approximately 160,000 people are eligible to use the Resiliency and Education Center. 54,600 people work on post; 56% are civilians, 28% are military, and contractors make up 16%. Other eligible patrons total 104,800 including retiree dependents (38.5%), active dependents (23.2%), retirees (14%), Dept. of Defense (DoD) dependents (13.7%), active military not on post, reserve members and dependents, and DoD civilians not on post.
