10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

CASA is the foremost Latino and immigrant organization in the mid-Atlantic region and a national leader in immigrant and working-class families have the supports necessary for full participation in society. CASA was founded in 1985 and its mission is to create a more just society by building power and improving the quality of life in working class and immigrant communities. CASA starts with families and communities, and builds out to achieve collective impact at the state, regional and national levels. CASA has 7 locations throughout Maryland, as well as a presence in southcentral Pennsylvania and northern Virginia. CASA has over 96,000 all-time members and serves over 37,000 people annually. We seek to empower immigrant families; ensure youth successfully transition to adulthood; expand good jobs, housing, and health and safety; and transform neighborhoods.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

CASA currently operates a welcome center in Rockville at a county-owned facility at 14645 Rothgeb Drive. This is part of a partnership between CASA and Montgomery County to provide employment & training services to low-income workers. At this center, over 200 workers were placed in nearly 2,000 jobs in 2017. The building currently includes nearly 9,000 square-feet of unused space. At the request of the county, CASA created a design for the vacant space to expand vocational training opportunities for low-wage workers. This includes a health training lab and equipment, maintenance mock rooms, HVAC and electrical training labs, and additional classroom space. A phase 1, which will make 5,000 square feet immediately usable, would establish Building Maintenance, Electric/Solar training labs, and establish new classroom areas, and insulate the walls in all the training areas.

28. Comments

CASA has operated welcome centers in Maryland since 1994 in response to growing numbers of contingent workers seeking work at unofficial hiring sites. Working in partnership with local governments, CASA established centers that provide job placement services, educational classes, financial services and supports, legal services, ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) instruction for workers and their families. CASA currently operates Welcome Centers in Silver Spring, Wheaton, Rockville, Baltimore, and Langley Park. Through these centers we place workers in 11,000 jobs annually, generating more than \$3.3M in annual earnings for workers and their families.

Montgomery County requested CASAs assistance in establishing a Shady Grove / Rockville Welcome Center, which opened in the spring of 2007. In 2015, this center was moved to its current location at 14645 Rothgeb Drive, Rockville, MD 20850. At this location, CASA provides job placement and screening services, English classes, citizenship and naturalization supports, citizenship / civics classes, financial literacy workshops and financial services, legal services, and social services and health promotion. CASA also created a small mobile vocational training lab to provide instruction in building maintenance, electricity, carpentry, and tiling, among others. CASA partners with local community colleges and other providers to provide industry-recognized instruction in these and other areas.

One of the major obstacles for low-wage workers, especially immigrant workers, in achieving economic self-sufficiency and longer-term employment is vocational skills and language skills. As such, additional training space to provide instruction in additional areas such as Building Maintenance Engineering, solar panel installation, and additional trainings in the health care industry, as well as expansion of ESOL instruction, would expand workforce opportunities for low-wage workers, thus resulting in improved job placement, retention, and earnings metrics.

CASA was approached by Montgomery County to create a plan to convert approximately 9,000 square feet of unused space at the Rothgeb location into vocational training and classroom space. We worked with an architect to create a design which included a health training lab and equipment, maintenance mock rooms, HVAC and electrical training labs, and additional classroom space. Encore Design also priced out the complete project, which totaled \$1,040,000.

Upon advice from county and state partners, CASA worked with the architect to define a less expensive phase 1 of the project that could stand alone in its improvements and make approximately 5,000 square feet of space immediately usable. This would establish Building Maintenance, Electric/Solar training labs, and establish new classroom areas, and insulate the walls in all the training areas.
