## Civil Actions - Noneconomic Damages

- FOR the purpose of altering the maximum amount of noneconomic damages that may be recovered in certain wrongful death actions or survival actions arising on or after a certain date; providing that a jury may be informed of a certain limitation on noneconomic damages in certain civil actions; making a clarifying change; and generally relating to noneconomic damages in certain civil actions.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 22 (a) (1) [This] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS

- 6 (b) (1) (i) Except as provided in paragraph (2)(ii) of this subsection, an award or verdict under this subtitle for noneconomic damages for a cause of action arising between January 1, 2005, and December 31, 2008, inclusive, may not exceed \$650,000.
- 9 (ii) The limitation on noneconomic damages provided under 10 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall increase by \$15,000 on January 1 of each year 11 beginning January 1, 2009. The increased amount shall apply to causes of action arising 12 between January 1 and December 31 of that year, inclusive.
- 13 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the 14 limitation under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall apply in the aggregate to all claims 15 for personal injury and wrongful death arising from the same medical injury, regardless of 16 the number of claims, claimants, plaintiffs, beneficiaries, or defendants.
- (ii) If there is a wrongful death action in which there are two or more claimants or beneficiaries, whether or not there is a personal injury action arising from the same medical injury, the total amount awarded for noneconomic damages for all actions may not exceed 125% of the limitation established under paragraph (1) of this subsection, regardless of the number of claims, claimants, plaintiffs, beneficiaries, or defendants.

- 23 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 24 (2) (i) "Noneconomic damages" means:
- 25 1. In an action for personal injury, pain, suffering, 26 inconvenience, physical impairment, disfigurement, loss of consortium, or other 27 nonpecuniary injury; and
- 2. In an action for wrongful death, mental anguish, emotional pain and suffering, loss of society, companionship, comfort, protection, care, marital care, parental care, filial care, attention, advice, counsel, training, guidance, or education, or other noneconomic damages authorized under Title 3, Subtitle 9 of this article.
- 33 (ii) "Noneconomic damages" does not include punitive damages.
- 34 (3) "Primary claimant" means a claimant in an action for the death of a person described under § 3–904(d) of this article.

- 1 (4) "Secondary claimant" means a claimant in an action for the death of a person described under § 3–904(e) of this article.
- 3 (b) (1) In any action for damages for personal injury in which the cause of action arises on or after July 1, 1986, an award for noneconomic damages may not exceed \$350,000.
- 6 (2) (i) Except as provided in paragraph (3)(ii) of this subsection, in any action for damages for personal injury or wrongful death in which the cause of action arises on or after October 1, 1994, an award for noneconomic damages may not exceed \$500,000.
- 9 (ii) The limitation on noneconomic damages provided under 10 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall increase by \$15,000 on October 1 of each year 11 beginning on October 1, 1995. The increased amount shall apply to causes of action arising 12 between October 1 of that year and September 30 of the following year, inclusive.
- 13 (3) (i) The limitation established under paragraph (2) of this subsection 14 shall apply in a personal injury action to each direct victim of tortious conduct and all 15 persons who claim injury by or through that victim.
- (ii) In a wrongful death action in which there are two or more claimants or beneficiaries, an award for noneconomic damages may not exceed [150%] 450% of the limitation established under paragraph (2) of this subsection, regardless of the number of claimants or beneficiaries who share in the award.
- 20 (c) An award by the health claims arbitration panel in accordance with § 21 3–2A–05 of this article for damages in which the cause of action arose before January 1, 22 2005, shall be considered an award for purposes of this section.
- 23 (d) (1) In a jury trial, the jury may [not] be informed of the limitation 24 established under subsection (b) of this section.
- 25 (2) (i) If the jury awards an amount for noneconomic damages that 26 exceeds the limitation established under subsection (b) of this section, the court shall 27 reduce the amount to conform to the limitation.
- 28 (ii) In a wrongful death action in which there are two or more 29 claimants or beneficiaries, if the jury awards an amount for noneconomic damages that 30 exceeds the limitation established under subsection (b)(3)(ii) of this section, the court shall:
- 31 1. If the amount of noneconomic damages for the primary 32 claimants equals or exceeds the limitation under subsection (b)(3)(ii) of this section:
- A. Reduce each individual award of a primary claimant proportionately to the total award of all of the primary claimants so that the total award to all claimants or beneficiaries conforms to the limitation; and
