### AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, strike beginning with "Alcoholic" in line 2 down through "<u>Permits</u>" in line 3 and substitute "<u>Workgroup on Alcohol Outlet Density Zones</u>"; strike beginning with "<u>repealing</u>" in line 5 down through "circumstances;" in line 10; in line 14, strike "<u>requiring</u>" and substitute "<u>authorizing</u>"; in line 15, strike "<u>designate</u>" and substitute "<u>identify</u>"; strike beginning with "<u>requiring</u>" in line 18 down through "<u>contingency</u>;" in line 21; in line 21, strike "<u>certain provisions of</u>"; and in line 22, strike "licenses <u>and</u> <u>permits</u>".

#### AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 2 through 4, strike beginning with "BY" in line 1 on page 2 down through "<u>ENACTED</u>" in line 22 on page 4, and substitute "<u>SECTION 1. BE IT</u> <u>ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND</u>".

On page 4, in line 30, after "<u>(3)</u>" insert "<u>the Dean of the University of Maryland</u> <u>School of Public Health, or the Dean's designee;</u>

<u>(4)</u>";

and in line 32, strike "(4)" and substitute "(5)".

On page 5, in lines 1, 3, 5, and 6, strike "(5)", "(6)", "(7)", and "(8)", respectively, and substitute "(6)", "(7)", "(8)", and "(9)", respectively; in line 17, strike "shall designate" and substitute "may identify potential"; in line 19, strike "designation" and substitute "identification of potential areas"; in line 20, strike "shall" and substitute "may"; in line 21, strike "designate" and substitute "propose"; in the same line, strike "each" and substitute "any"; and strike in their entirety lines 29 through 31, inclusive.
