4 FOR the purpose of ~~requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to include questions on the~~  
5 ~~recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking as part of the~~  
6 ~~commercial driver's license knowledge test;~~ requiring commercial driver's license  
7 training schools to include training on the recognition, prevention, and effective  
8 reporting of human trafficking as part of the curriculum; requiring the  
9 Administration to include content on the recognition, prevention, and effective  
10 reporting of human trafficking in its Commercial Driver's License Manual; requiring  
11 the Administration to provide ~~content~~ information on the recognition, prevention,  
12 and effective reporting of human trafficking from the Manual to applicants renewing  
13 their commercial driver's licenses; and generally relating to commercial driver's  
14 licenses.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
 7 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 ~~(b) (1) Except as provided in § 16–807.1 of this subtitle, an individual may not~~  
 11 ~~be issued a commercial driver’s license until the individual has passed the knowledge and~~  
 12 ~~skill tests for driving a commercial motor vehicle which complies with the minimum federal~~  
 13 ~~standards established by the federal Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986 (Title~~  
 14 ~~XII of Public Law 99–570), and has satisfied all other requirements of that act as well as~~  
 15 ~~any other requirements of this title.~~

16 ~~(2) The tests shall be prescribed and conducted at the direction of the~~  
 17 ~~Administration AND, IN ADDITION TO FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS, SHALL INCLUDE~~

24 **(A) A COMMERCIAL DRIVER’S LICENSE TRAINING SCHOOL SHALL INCLUDE**  
 25 **AS PART OF ITS CURRICULUM EDUCATION AND TRAINING ON THE RECOGNITION,**  
 26 **PREVENTION, AND EFFECTIVE REPORTING OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING.**

27 **(B) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL:**

28 **(1) INCLUDE AS PART OF ITS COMMERCIAL DRIVER’S LICENSE**  
 29 **MANUAL CONTENT ON THE RECOGNITION, PREVENTION, AND EFFECTIVE**  
 30 **REPORTING OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING; AND**

31 **(2) ~~ON REQUEST, PROVIDE~~ PROVIDE TO AN APPLICANT RENEWING A**  
 32 **COMMERCIAL DRIVER’S LICENSE ~~CONTENT~~ INFORMATION FROM THE MANUAL ON**  
 33 **THE RECOGNITION, PREVENTION, AND EFFECTIVE REPORTING OF HUMAN**
