# Commercial Driver's Licenses – Recognition, Prevention, and Reporting of Human Trafficking

FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to include questions on the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking as part of the 6 commercial driver's license knowledge test; requiring commercial driver's license 7 training schools to include training on the recognition, prevention, and effective 8 reporting of human trafficking as part of the curriculum; requiring the 9 Administration to include content on the recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking in its Commercial Driver's License Manual; requiring 10 11 the Administration to provide <del>content</del> information on the recognition, prevention, 12and effective reporting of human trafficking from the Manual to applicants renewing 13 their commercial driver's licenses; and generally relating to commercial driver's 14licenses.
