1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Reporting of Hate Crimes**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for the reporting, collection, and analysis
4 of information relating to hate crimes to require the Department of State Police to
5 collect and analyze information about incidents apparently directed against an
6 individual or a group because of color, religious beliefs, gender, disability, national
7 origin, or homelessness; altering certain information required to be provided by each
8 local law enforcement agency and the State Fire Marshal to the Department; altering
9 certain information for which the Department is required to adopt procedures for
10 collection and analysis; altering certain information about which the Department is
11 required to make certain reports to the Commission on Civil Rights; and generally
12 relating to the reporting of hate crimes.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Criminal Law**

4 10–304.

5 Because of another person’s or group’s race, color, religious beliefs, sexual
6 orientation, gender, disability, or national origin, or because another person or group is
7 homeless, a person may not:

8 (1) (i) commit a crime or attempt to commit a crime against that person
9 or group;

10 (ii) damage the real or personal property of that person or group;

11 (iii) deface, damage, or destroy, or attempt to deface, damage, or
12 destroy the real or personal property of that person or group; or

13 (iv) burn or attempt to burn an object on the real or personal property
14 of that person or group; or

15 (2) commit a violation of item (1) of this section that:

16 (i) except as provided in item (ii) of this item, involves a separate
17 crime that is a felony; or

18 (ii) results in the death of a victim.

19 **Article – Public Safety**

20 2–307.

21 (a) The Department shall collect, analyze, and disseminate information about the
22 incidence of crime in the State.

23 (b) (1) The Department shall collect and analyze information about incidents
24 apparently directed against an individual or group because of race, [religion, ethnicity, or]
25 **COLOR, RELIGIOUS BELIEFS**, sexual orientation, **GENDER, DISABILITY, NATIONAL**
26 **ORIGIN, OR HOMELESSNESS**.

27 (2) Each local law enforcement agency and the State Fire Marshal shall
28 provide the Department with the information described in paragraph (1) of this subsection.

29 (3) The Department shall adopt procedures for the collection and analysis
30 of the information described in paragraph (1) of this subsection.

1 (4) The Department shall make monthly reports to the Commission on
2 Civil Rights about the information described in paragraph (1) of this subsection.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 2019.
