- 3 FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for the reporting, collection, and analysis 4 of information relating to hate crimes to require the Department of State Police to $\mathbf{5}$ collect and analyze information about incidents apparently directed against an 6 individual or a group because of color, religious beliefs, gender, disability, national 7 origin, or homelessness; altering certain information required to be provided by each 8 local law enforcement agency and the State Fire Marshal to the Department; altering 9 certain information for which the Department is required to adopt procedures for 10 collection and analysis; altering certain information about which the Department is 11 required to make certain reports to the Commission on Civil Rights; and generally 12 relating to the reporting of hate crimes.
