## Election Law - Certificates of Candidacy and Nomination - Revisions

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring candidates nominated by a new political party to file a 4 certificate of candidacy by a certain date and time, comply with certain requirements 5 for a certificate of candidacy, and file a certificate of nomination with the appropriate 6 board and on a certain form; requiring the presiding officers of a national party 7 convention to file a certificate of nomination with the State Board of Elections within 8 a certain time period after the conclusion of the national party convention; repealing 9 the requirement for the Anne Arundel County Board of Education to provide certain 10 notice to the State Board by a certain date; authorizing the State Administrator of 11 Elections to designate temporary satellite locations to receive a certificate of candidacy; and generally relating to certificates of candidacy and nomination. 12

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 24 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 2 (f) (1) Unless a new political party is required to hold a primary election to nominate its candidates under Title 8 of this article, the new political party may nominate its candidates in accordance with the constitution and bylaws adopted by the political party and submitted to the State Board.
- 6 (2) THE CANDIDATES NOMINATED BY THE NEW POLITICAL PARTY 7 SHALL:
- 8 (I) FILE A CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY NO LATER THAN 5 P.M. 9 ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN AUGUST IN THE YEAR OF THE GENERAL ELECTION FOR 10 THE OFFICE;
- 11 (II) COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A CERTIFICATE OF 12 CANDIDACY UNDER TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 3 OF THIS ARTICLE; AND
- (III) FILE WITH THE APPROPRIATE BOARD, ON A FORM THE STATE BOARD PRESCRIBES, A CERTIFICATE OF NOMINATION SIGNED BY THE OFFICERS OF THE NEW POLITICAL PARTY.

- 17 (g) (1) A candidate for President or Vice President of the United States 18 nominated by a national party convention is not required to file a certificate of candidacy 19 under this section.
- 20 (2) If more than one written notice naming different presidential and vice 21 presidential nominees is provided to the State Board by persons purporting to be the 22 presiding officer of the same party convention, the State Board shall require the chairman 23 of the State party to provide written reaffirmation of the party's nominees within 5 days 24 after the State Board's demand.
- 25 (3) THE PRESIDING OFFICERS OF THE NATIONAL PARTY CONVENTION 26 SHALL FILE A CERTIFICATE OF NOMINATION WITH THE STATE BOARD WITHIN 5 DAYS AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE NATIONAL PARTY CONVENTION.
- [(h) (1) On or before August 31 in the year in which a member of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education must stand for continuance in office, the Anne Arundel County Board of Education shall provide written notice to the State Board of the name of the member that is to be placed on the ballot at the next succeeding general election.
- 32 (2) An incumbent member of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education 33 is not required to file a certificate of candidacy for an election for continuance in office.]
