## Prince George's County - Elementary School - Limit on Class Size

PG 503-19
FOR the purpose of requiring the Prince George's County Board of Education to limit the number of students assigned to a classroom teacher of students in kindergarten through grade 3 in the public schools in the county; defining a certain term; and generally relating to a limit on the class size for students in certain grades in the Prince George's County public schools.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education
3-1009.

## IN § 7-119 OF THIS ARTICLE.

(B) THE COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A LIMIT OF NOT MORE THAN 30 STUDENTS IN A CLASS FOR A CLASSROOM TEACHER ASSIGNED TO TEACH STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE 3 IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTY.

7-119.
(a) (1) In this section, "classroom teacher" means a teacher who is primarily responsible and accountable for the students in that class.
(2) "Classroom teacher" does not include:
(i) Curriculum specialists;
(ii) Guidance counselors;
(iii) Librarians;
(iv) Media specialists;
(v) Instructional aides;
(vi) Attendance personnel;
(vii) Health services personnel;
(viii) Psychologists;
(ix) Social workers;
(x) Clerical personnel;
(xi) Community college staff; or
(xii) Any other individual whose job does not require skill in the field of education and who is not responsible for the day-to-day instruction of the same group of students.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
