## Workers' Compensation – Medical Presumptions

- FOR the purpose of altering the types of cancer that are considered occupational diseases suffered in the line of duty and are compensable in a certain manner; and generally

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 14 Article – Labor and Employment

- 16 (c) A paid firefighter, paid firefighting instructor, paid rescue squad member,
- 17 paid advanced life support unit member, or a sworn member of the Office of the State Fire
- 18 Marshal employed by an airport authority, a county, a fire control district, a municipality,
- 19 or the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue
- 20 squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member who is a covered employee
- 21 under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that
- 22 was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if the individual:



## **HOUSE BILL 233**

- 1 (1) has leukemia or prostate, rectal, throat, multiple myeloma, 2 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, brain, testicular, **BLADDER**, **KIDNEY OR RENAL CELL**, or 3 breast cancer that is caused by contact with a toxic substance that the individual has 4 encountered in the line of duty;
- 5 (2) has completed at least 10 years of service as a firefighter, firefighting 6 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member or in a combination 7 of those jobs in the department where the individual currently is employed or serves;
- 8 (3) is unable to perform the normal duties of a firefighter, firefighting 9 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member in the department 10 where the individual currently is employed or serves because of the cancer or leukemia 11 disability; and
- 12 (4) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, 13 volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member, has met 14 a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a firefighter, firefighting 15 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 October 1, 2019.
