A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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2020 Census Complete Count Commission

FOR the purpose of establishing the 2020 Census Complete Count Commission; providing 4 that the Commission is an independent Commission functioning within the Department of Planning; providing for the composition, chair, staffing, and purpose of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission to determine the State agencies that are able to support the purpose of the Commission, develop and implement a certain plan, develop and implement a certain public awareness campaign, and establish a certain website that includes certain information; authorizing the Commission to coordinate with a certain entity and establish subcommittees; requiring the Commission to submit certain reports to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 2020 Census Complete Count Commission.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 16 17 That:
- 18 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 19 (2)"Commission" means the 2020 Census Complete Count Commission.
- 20 "Hard-to-count populations" means population groups that have a 21higher risk of being undercounted in the 2020 Census, including:
 - (i) young children;

The Commission shall:

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4 1 (1) determine the State agencies that are able to support the purpose of the 2 Commission: 3 in coordination with the relevant State agencies determined under item 4 (1) of this subsection, develop and implement a plan to ensure the fair and accurate 5 counting of individuals in hard-to-count populations for the 2020 Census; 6 develop and implement a public awareness campaign that promotes (3)7 public awareness of and participation in the 2020 Census; and 8 **(4)** establish a public website to share information about the 2020 Census, 9 the Commission, hard-to-count populations, and any other information the Commission 10 determines appropriate to serve the purpose of the Commission. 11 (i) The Commission may: 12 (1) coordinate with the 2020 Census Grant Program Panel; and 13 (2) establish subcommittees. On or before November 30, 2019, the Commission shall submit an 14 (i) (1)interim report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government 15 Article, the General Assembly. 16 17 On or before June 30, 2020, the Commission shall submit a final report (2) on its work to ensure the fair and accurate counting of individuals in hard-to-count 18 19 populations in the 2020 Census to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly. 2021SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 221, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 6 months and, at the end of 23 December 31, 2020, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall 24be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
