BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 3 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 4 **Article – Health Occupations** 1A-101. 5 6 In this title the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) 7 "Acupuncture" means a form of health care[,] based on [a theory] EAST (b) 8 ASIAN MEDICAL THEORIES of energetic physiology[,] that [describes] DESCRIBE the interrelationship of the body organs [or] AND functions [with an associated point or 9 combination of points]. 10 11 "Auricular detoxification" means an acupuncture technique involving the 12 needling of the external auricle of the human ear for the purpose of assisting a person who 13 is undergoing detoxification to remove addictive substances from the body and restoring 14 health. 15 "Board" means the State Acupuncture Board. (d) 16 "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued by the 17 Board to practice acupuncture. 18 "Practice acupuncture" means the use of [oriental] EAST ASIAN 19 medical therapies for the purpose of normalizing energetic physiological functions 20including pain control, and for the promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health. 21(2) "Practice acupuncture" includes: 22 Stimulation of [points of] the body by the insertion of 23[acupuncture] needles; 24The application of moxibustion; and (ii) 25Manual, mechanical, thermal, [or] electrical, LIGHT, COLD 26 LASER, HERBAL, NUTRITIONAL, THERAPEUTIC EXERCISE, DRY NEEDLING, OR 27 OTHER EAST ASIAN MEDICAL therapies only when performed in accordance with the principles of [oriental acupuncture] EAST ASIAN medical theories AND PRACTICES. 28 29 "Supervision" means: (g)

30 (1) A formalized professional relationship between a licensed 31 acupuncturist and an individual performing auricular detoxification that provides

4 5	(i) Periodic direct supervision where the licensed acupuncturist is present or on–site during treatment; and

9 10	(a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
11	(b) The applicant shall:
12	(1) Be of good moral character;
13	(2) Be at least 18 years old;
14 15	(3) Demonstrate competence in performing acupuncture by meeting one of the following standards for education or training:
16 17 18	(i) Graduation from [a course of training of at least 1,800 hours in acupuncture, including 300 clinical hours,] AT LEAST A MASTER'S LEVEL PROGRAM <u>OR</u> <u>ITS EQUIVALENT</u> IN ACUPUNCTURE that is:
19 20	$1. \text{Approved} \text{by the Maryland Higher Education} \\ \text{Commission; } \mathbf{\Theta}\mathbf{R}$
21 22	2. Accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or

27 28	1. Diplomate in acupuncture from the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or

5	(5) Meet any other qualifications that the Board establishes in regulations

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That § 1A–302 of the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any individual licensed to practice acupuncture by the State Acupuncture Board before the effective date of this Act.
