- 2 State Acupuncture Board Practice of Acupuncture Definition and Education Requirements
- FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant to have graduated from a certain program approved by certain entities to qualify for a license to practice acupuncture; repealing the authority of the State Acupuncture Board to find certain programs to be equivalent to a certain course for certain licensure requirements; altering certain definitions; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the practice of acupuncture.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 1 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated. 2 "Acupuncture" means a form of health care[,] based on [a theory] EAST ASIAN MEDICAL THEORIES of energetic physiology[,] that [describes] DESCRIBE the 3 interrelationship of the body organs [or] AND functions [with an associated point or 4 combination of points]. 5 6 "Auricular detoxification" means an acupuncture technique involving the 7 needling of the external auricle of the human ear for the purpose of assisting a person who 8 is undergoing detoxification to remove addictive substances from the body and restoring 9 health. 10 (d) "Board" means the State Acupuncture Board. "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued by the 11 (e) 12 Board to practice acupuncture. 13 "Practice acupuncture" means the use of [oriental] EAST ASIAN 14 medical therapies for the purpose of normalizing energetic physiological functions 15 including pain control, and for the promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health. "Practice acupuncture" includes: 16 (2) 17 Stimulation of [points of] the body by the insertion of (i) 18 [acupuncture] needles; The application of moxibustion; and 19 (ii) 20(iii) Manual, mechanical, thermal, [or] electrical, LIGHT, COLD LASER, HERBAL, NUTRITIONAL, THERAPEUTIC EXERCISE, DRY NEEDLING, OR 2122 OTHER EAST ASIAN MEDICAL therapies only when performed in accordance with the 23 principles of [oriental acupuncture] EAST ASIAN medical theories AND PRACTICES. 24(g) "Supervision" means: 25formalized professional relationship between licensed 26 acupuncturist and an individual performing auricular detoxification that provides 27 evaluation and direction of the individual to adequately ensure the safety and welfare of 28 clients during the course of treatment; and 29 (2) As defined by the Board in regulations:
- 30 (i) Periodic direct supervision where the licensed acupuncturist is 31 present or on–site during treatment; and

14 15	1. Approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission; OR							
16 17	2. Accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or							
18 19	[3. Found by the Board to be equivalent to a course approved by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or]							
20	(ii) Achievement of a:							
21 22	1. Diplomate in acupuncture from the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or
